After a hearing on the Motion To Intervene For The Limited Purpose Of Terminating Orders Of Impoundment filed by GateHouse Media, Inc. and the Motion To Terminate Impoundment Orders filed by Globe Newspaper Company, Inc. ("the Intervenors"), I make the following decision and order:

DECISION AND ORDER

In accordance with the Uniform Rules on Impoundment Procedure and the process outlined in The Republican Co. v. Appeals Court, 442 Mass. 219, 227 at n. 14 (2004), a hearing was held before me on the aforesaid Motions filed by the Intervenors to terminate certain Impoundment Orders ("the Orders") issued recently by the Attleboro District Court in connection with a criminal prosecution pending against the defendant, Aaron Hernandez.

Upon reviewing the relevant case law and hearing argument on the Intervenors' request to terminate the Orders impounding the search warrants, search warrant affidavits, applications for search warrant, search warrant returns, and the impoundment motions filed by the Commonwealth, I find there is no longer good cause for continued closure of such records. In addition, I do not find that the defendant has established a substantial probability that permitting access to the impounded information will prejudice his fair trial rights, or that impounding or closure of the subject records would be effective in protecting those rights. The burden is on the parties seeking continued impoundment and after hearing, I find this burden has not been met and that termination of the Orders would be appropriate at this time. Commonwealth and William O'Connell v. George W. Prescott Publishing Co., LLC, 463 Mass. 258 (2012), see also New England Internet Café, LLC v. Clerk of the Superior Court For Criminal Business in Suffolk County, 462 Mass. 76 (2012). However, given the important interests at stake, I will

stay the effect of this order approximately twenty four (24) hours to afford any interested parties the right to exercise further judicial review.

Wherefore, the Orders of impoundment relating to the aforesaid documents shall terminate effective as of 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, July 9, 2013 unless ordered otherwise by a court of competent jurisdiction. So Ordered.

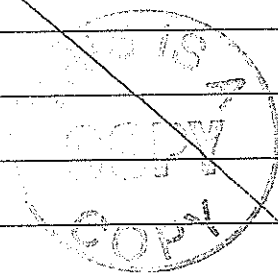

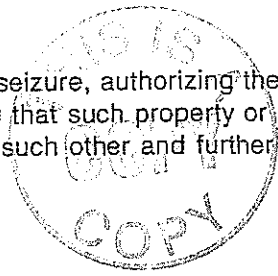


Now comes the Commonwealth in regard to the above-captioned matter and respectfully requests that this Honorable Court order that the search warrant application, the search warrant, the affidavit in support of the search warrant, the search warrant return and the Commonwealth's motion and affidavit to seal and impound be sealed and impounded until further order. The Commonwealth states that these search warrants concern an active and ongoing homicide investigation. The enumerated documents contain details of the facts of the incident, actions of the police, statements of individuals, etc. known to the investigators in this matter. The release of this information would allow unfettered access to it and this would hinder the ability of the investigators to pursue investigative leads in this matter and hinder the ongoing criminal investigation. For this reason, the Commonwealth respectfully requests that This Honorable Court seal and impound the enumerated documents and preclude any and all access to them, or information dissemination about them until further notice of the Court. 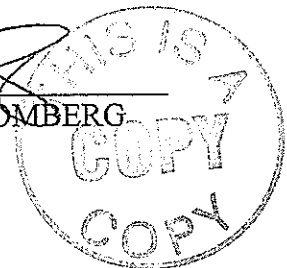
AFFIDAVIT

I, Patrick O. Bomberg, hereby depose and state the following:

1. I am an Assistant District Attorney;
2. I am assigned to the investigation of the homicide of Odin Lloyd which occurred in North Attleboro on or about June 17, 2013;
3. This investigation into this homicide is active and ongoing. The investigation is likely to be ongoing for an extended period of time and will include the use of the Bristol County Grand Jury;
4. The search warrants that are the subject of this motion describe the focus of the investigation as well as the Commonwealth's view of the evidence which led to the issuance of the warrant;
5. In my experience and the experience of other investigators, the destruction of physical evidence and/or the possibility that witness information will be altered is inherent in an investigation of this type and the risk of either of these occurrences would be increased if the information contained in these warrants, returns, affidavits, applications and these motions is publicly released;
6. Consequently, release of this information would interfere with the Commonwealth's ability to continued to obtain information relevant and material to the investigation; and
7. Because of the non-public nature of the Commonwealth's request, the fact of the on-going investigation, the possibility that the investigation will be harmed if the information is released and the use of the powers of the Grand Jury in this request, the Commonwealth believes that all materials submitted with this motion should be Sealed and Impounded.



Affidavit in Support of Application for Search Warrant

I, Daniel M Giossi, being duly sworn, depose and say:

1. I am a Massachusetts State Police Officer and have been a Police Officer since 1996. I am presently assigned to the Bristol County District Attorney's Office. Prior to my employment with the State Police I was a Federal Law Enforcement Officer with the U.S. Coast Guard and was actively involved in the enforcement of Maritime Laws and Federal Laws governing the smuggling of narcotics. I have been assigned to the State Police Detective Unit for the Bristol County District Attorney's Office since 2007. During my time in Bristol County as a Police Officer I have investigated and processed serious and violent crimes including murders, attempted murders, assaults and sexual assaults. I have received training and experience in the collection of physical evidence, crime scene processing and the investigation of crimes involving death. I have been the affiant on several search warrants in both the District and Superior Courts of the Commonwealth related to investigations involving death. I have received additional training in the seizing and searching of cellular phones and other such portable devices and have searched numerous cellular phones pursuant to search warrants. I have personal knowledge of the facts and circumstances related below, as the result of my own investigative efforts and those of other law enforcement officers who have reported their findings to me.

2. Based upon my training and experience, and the collective knowledge of the other officers that I have worked with on this investigation as noted in my affidavit, I believe that a homicide occurred in the area of 344 John Dietch Blvd, N Attleboro, MA.

3. The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant are as follows:



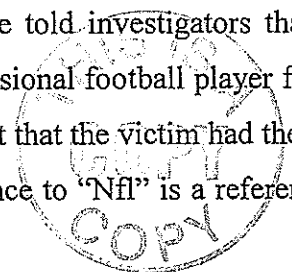
4. On June 17, 2013 at approximately 1737 hours (5:37 p.m.) the North Attleboro Police Department received a 911 call reporting a body in the area of 344 John Dietch Blvd, North Attleboro, MA.

5. On June 17, 2013 the North Attleboro Police Department located a deceased male that had been shot several times. The male was identified as Odin L Lloyd, DOB: 11/14/1985. A cellular phone was found on the deceased male, the phone was seized by investigators and a search was conducted of the phone to look for information related to his death. During the search of the phone recent activity was recovered and exported. The recent activity included call logs and text messages that were sent and received.

6. According to the call logs the victim at 0022 hours on June 17, 2013 sent a text message to phone number [REDACTED] and wrote "We still on". There was no response to the text. Subsequently the victim called the same number [REDACTED] at 0050 hours, and 0103 hours two times. The quote "We still on" indicated that the victim and the user of [REDACTED] had made plans to do something together. The last messages sent by the victim were sent to his sister during which he wrote at 0307 hours "U saw who I'm with", at 0311 hours the victim wrote "Hello". At 0319 hours the victim's sister replied "My phone was dead who was that?" The victim replied to his sister "Nfl". His sister replied at 0322 hours "Lol your aggy". The last text sent by the victim was at 0323 hours when he wrote to his sister "Just so u know".

7. Another item found on the victim was a set of keys for a rental car from Enterprise Rental. Investigators contacted Enterprise Rental and learned that the vehicle was rented to Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C Meyer Dr, North Attleboro. 22 Ronald C Meyer Dr is located almost across the street from where the body was found. Aaron Hernandez is a professional football player for the NFL. Investigators contacted Aaron Hernandez and asked that he come to the North Attleboro Police Station to be interviewed. When Aaron Hernandez arrived he had a cellular phone with him.

8. Investigators were able to contact the victim's sister and she told investigators that her brother, the victim, had been hanging out with Aaron Hernandez a professional football player for the New England Patriots. Based upon the statements of the sister and the fact that the victim had the keys to a car rented by Aaron Hernandez investigators believe that the reference to "Nfl" is a reference to



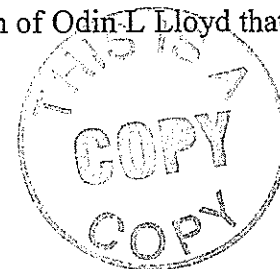
Aaron Hernandez. In order to further confirm the user of the phone number [REDACTED] identity, investigators called the number while Aaron Hernandez was in the interview room, and observed the phone of Aaron Hernandez ringing when they dialed the number.

9. Investigators know that cellular phones retain data concerning call logs, messages sent and received, contact information, location data, pictures, image files, dates and times and other information that can be useful to investigators during criminal investigations.

10. Based upon the above facts and circumstances probable cause exists to believe that the cellular phone of Aaron Hernandez with cellular phone number [REDACTED] will contain information regarding conversations that occurred between his phone and the victim. I know from past experience that cellular phone companies do not keep records concerning the actual text messages sent and received by the phone and that the best way to recover the actual messages is to recover them from the phone. Investigators do have the ability to obtain the messages, phone logs and other data that can be found on the phones in a forensically sound environment with specialized equipment and training that investigators in this case possess. Even if the messages, calls, contacts, and other data files are deleted by the user the data can often be recovered using forensically sound techniques.

11. I also have knowledge, based upon my experience and training that if untrained persons are allowed into a crime scene, they may unintentionally disturb, damage, or obliterate crucial evidence. Accordingly, while the crime scene search warrant is being executed, I respectfully seek the court's authority to impound and secure the property and to keep out all unauthorized persons not assigned to the investigation.

12. Based upon the above, there is probable cause to believe that evidence related to the death of Odin L Lloyd will be found on the cellular phone in the possession of Aaron Hernandez with phone number [REDACTED] I respectfully request that the Court issue a warrant and order of seizure, and further authorizing the search of the cellular phone with number [REDACTED] for data files including call logs, text messages, image files, videos, voice mails, location data, contact lists and other data files that can reasonably be related to the investigation into the death of Odin L Lloyd that occurred in the town of North Attleboro on or about June 17, 2013.

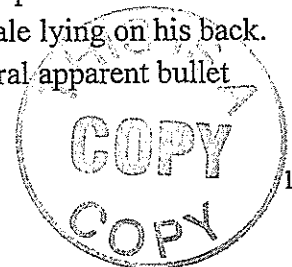
I, Michael F. Cherven, being duly sworn, hereby depose and say that: I am a Trooper with the Massachusetts State Police with the rank of Trooper. I have been a member of the Massachusetts State Police since May 1996, and have been assigned to a number of duty stations within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts as a uniformed state trooper. I have also been assigned to the State Fire Marshal's office where I investigated hundreds of explosives related cases including bombings, arson and murders.

In January of 2007, I was assigned to the Massachusetts State Police Detective Unit of Bristol County, an assignment that I currently hold. My duties include, but are not limited to, the investigation of various major crimes, including homicides, motor vehicle homicides, narcotics, rapes, internet based crimes and other violent crimes.

Based on my training and experience, and the collective knowledge of the other officers that I have worked with on this investigation as noted in my affidavit, I believe that a homicide occurred in the area of 344 John Dietch Boulevard, North Attleboro Ma.

The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant are as follows:

On Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 5:37 PM, North Attleboro Police Department responded to a cellular 911 call reporting a dead body behind 344 John Dietsch Boulevard North Attleboro, MA. North Attleboro Police responded to a secluded area behind 344 John Dietsch Boulevard and located a deceased male lying on his back. Upon inspection of the body, initial responding officers noted several apparent bullet



holes in the upper torso area of the unknown deceased black male. There was a small amount of blood in the area of the gunshot wounds. Next to the body officers observed (5) .45 caliber pistol casings. No firearm was found. Based on the physical evidence and a statement of a witness who heard gunshots as described later in this affidavit, investigators believe that a shooting occurred at this location. A subsequent search of the body found a Massachusetts drivers license in the name of Odin L. Lloyd, DOB: 11/14/1985 of 10 Fayston St., Apt. #2, Boston, MA. License photograph matched the deceased. Also located in the front right pants pocket of Mr. Lloyd were two sets of keys for an Enterprise Rental vehicle, bearing Rhode Island registration [REDACTED]. The keychain indicated that the registration belonged to a 2013 Chevrolet Suburban, color black.

CELL PHONE SEARCH

A cellular telephone was located in the right front sweatshirt pocket of Mr. Lloyd. This cellular telephone is a model HTC 1, with an assigned telephone number of [REDACTED]. This cellular telephone was seized by investigators and a search was conducted of the phone to search for information related to the death of Mr. Lloyd. During the search of the phone, recent activity was recovered and exported. The recent activity included call logs and text messages that were sent and received.

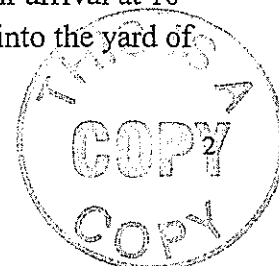
\$64.75 in cash was located in the back left pants pocket of Mr. Lloyd. In the opposite back right pants pocket were miscellaneous cards and personal items.

In the immediate vicinity of Mr. Lloyd's body, investigators observed a set of apparent automobile tire tracks that appeared to be a recent. The area surrounding Mr. Lloyd's body is used as a processing area for construction materials such as dirt, gravel, stone, asphalt, and fill. No vehicle was observed at the location of Mr. Lloyd's body.

RENTAL VEHICLE

A check of Enterprise Rental Car at TF Green airport in Rhode Island showed the vehicle described on the keys in the pocket of Mr. Lloyd [REDACTED] was currently being rented by Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. A check of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles shows an Aaron Hernandez, DOB: 11-06-1989 with a listed address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA.

Two Massachusetts State Police Troopers drove to 10 Fayston Street, Boston, MA. Their purpose was to make a death notification and interview Mr. Lloyd's friends and family members who may be associated with that address. Upon their arrival at 10 Fayston Street, these Troopers observed the Chevrolet Suburban backed into the yard of

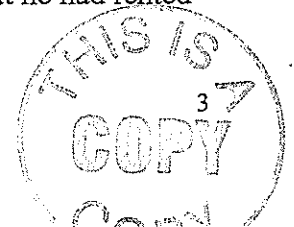


10 Fayston Street, behind a chain link fence. Massachusetts State Police Troop H dispatcher Bradley also made contact with Onstar. Onstar is a vehicle recovery tool that is used in many Chevrolet motor vehicles. Onstar indicated that they could assist police in locating the Chevrolet Suburban with Rhode Island registration [REDACTED] by employing its onboard Onstar system. The Onstar representative was informed that police believe it was necessary to locate the missing vehicle because occupants may be in danger due to the ongoing homicide investigation. Onstar representatives provided a location of 18 Fayston St. Boston, MA. This is in the immediate vicinity of Mr. Llyod's residence, 10 Fayston St. Boston, MA.

Separate from this activity, Detective Daniel Arrighi of the North Attleboro Police Department and this affiant drove to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. Upon the officers' arrival they were unable to make initial contact with any occupants inside the residence. Officers observed three (3) large surveillance cameras permanently fixed to the exterior of the residence. Det. Arrighi and I observed that the television was on inside the residence along with numerous lights. There were some drinking glasses on the couch and a bottle was tipped over in front of the television on the couch. However, ~~no occupants came to the door when the doorbell was used to summon the occupants.~~ Police having learned that the deceased Mr. Lloyd and the occupant of the house, Mr. Hernandez, were both connected to the then missing Chevrolet Suburban, these officers had concern for the safety of Mr. Hernandez. The officers walked to the rear of the house ~~using flashlights to determine if there was any forced entry or if there was sign of any~~ occupant. No signs of forced entry or occupants were observed.

The officers knocked on a neighbor's door and spoke with the occupants. These neighbors indicated that they knew Mr. Hernandez. One of the occupants identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots, Joe Judge. Mr. Judge indicated that he had last seen Mr. Hernandez on Thursday, June 13, 2013 after releasing Mr. Hernandez from practice along with other members of the New England Patriots. Mr. Judge did not have any contact information for Mr. Hernandez and was unable to provide us with any ~~information as to his whereabouts. Mr. Judge told this affiant that Aaron Hernandez is a~~ player for the New England Patriots.

At approximately 10:30 PM these officers were parked on the street in front of Mr. Hernandez's residence when they observed Mr. Hernandez exit the residence and walk down the driveway towards them. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had seen the officers in front of the house parked on the street through the video surveillance system. Det. Arrighi and I identified ourselves to Mr. Hernandez and began asking him questions about the black Chevy Suburban he had rented. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had rented

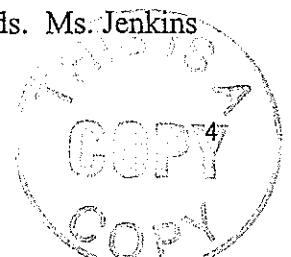


the vehicle for his friend "O". I asked who "O" was and Mr. Hernandez replied "Odin". I asked Mr. Hernandez how he knew Odin and he stated that his girlfriend's sister was dating Odin. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle from the Enterprise rental company on Rt. 1 in North Attleboro, MA. I asked when the last time he saw Odin was and he replied that he last saw Odin "up his way yesterday," indicating that he saw him last on Sunday, June 16, 2013 in Boston. Mr. Hernandez was unable to provide me a location where this was; however, he stated that he had the address saved on his GPS. Mr. Hernandez described that he observed us outside of his home on his video surveillance system. Mr. Hernandez then became argumentative with both Det. Arrighi and I and asked "what's with all the questions." He then stated that we would need to speak with his attorney. Mr. Hernandez then entered his residence, locking the door behind him, and he retrieved a business card for his attorney. Mr. Hernandez unlocked the door and handed the card to these officers. We informed Mr. Hernandez that this was a death investigation. Mr. Hernandez slammed the door and relocked it behind him. Mr. Hernandez did not ask officers whose death was being investigated. Mr. Hernandez's demeanor did not indicate any concern for the death of any person. Contact was then made with Mr. Hernandez's attorney.

SHAYANNA JENKINS

These officers returned to our vehicle. At approximately 10:40 PM while we remained parked in front of Mr. Hernandez's residence, Mr. Hernandez exited his residence and stated he would follow us to the police station to speak with us. Mr. Hernandez stated that his girlfriend would give him a ride. We followed Mr. Hernandez and his girlfriend to the North Attleboro Police Station which he entered. Mr. Hernandez's girlfriend then drove away from the police station. I followed her out of the lot and flashed my blue lights off and on and the vehicle pulled over adjacent to the North Attleboro Police Department. Det. Arrighi and I then spoke with the driver, identified as Ms. Shayanna Jenkins, DOB: 05-29-1989. I informed Ms. Jenkins about the death of Mr. Lloyd and she immediately began to cry. I asked her if she would speak to us in the parking lot of the Police Station. She agreed to speak there because her child was sleeping in the back seat of the vehicle.

Ms. Jenkins stated that she is the girlfriend of Aaron Hernandez and that they both live together at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. in North Attleboro. Ms. Jenkins stated that Mr. Lloyd dates her sister Shaneah Jenkins. Ms. Jenkins stated that she is not very familiar with Mr. Lloyd and that she does not know his family or any of his friends. Ms. Jenkins



stated that the connection between Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd is through her sister Shaneah. Ms. Jenkins stated that she last saw Mr. Lloyd on Saturday, June 15, 2013 at approximately 10:30 AM. Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd were both at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. in the black Suburban rental vehicle. Ms. Jenkins stated that Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd discussed returning the rental vehicle to Enterprise Rental.

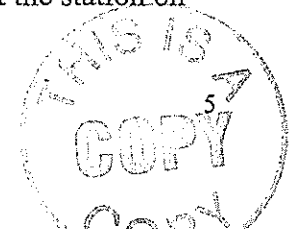
Ms. Jenkins indicated that she was aware that Mr. Lloyd smoked marijuana and that he also was a marijuana dealer. Ms. Jenkins stated that she would often observe Mr. Lloyd on his phone talking about marijuana sales. She stated that his phone was constantly ringing and that he was constantly talking in "lingo" that led her to believe the conversations were about marijuana sales. Ms. Jenkins provided investigators with the cell phone number for Mr. Hernandez as well as her sister Shaneah Jenkins. Ms. Jenkins also stated that Mr. Hernandez's cell phone number is [REDACTED].

Ms. Jenkins stated they had recently installed a video surveillance system within their residence. Ms. Jenkins stated that this video surveillance system would allow for the viewing of both the front of their residence as well as the street. Ms. Jenkins stated that the video surveillance system records and plays the video on their home entertainment system. Ms. Jenkins stated that there had been several recent break-in attempts at their residence located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma.

Ms. Jenkins stated that both she and Mr. Hernandez were home on Sunday, June 16, 2013 during the day. She stated that they had gone out to dinner for Father's Day later in the day and that a babysitter had stayed with their child. Ms. Jenkins stated that later that evening she had gone to bed early. However, she stated that she was aware that Mr. Hernandez was not home all night and that she was unsure of what time he got home or who he had gone out with. At this time during our conversation Mr. Hernandez called her on her cell phone and informed her that his sports agent said that she should not speak with us and that she should request to speak with her attorney.

ODIN LLOYD CELL PHONE

The cellular telephone recovered from the body of Mr. Lloyd was taken by investigators to the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators conducted a search of Mr. Lloyd's cellular phone at the police station. According to the cellular call logs Mr. Lloyd sent a text message to [REDACTED] (Mr. Hernandez's cell phone as provided by his girlfriend) on June 17, 2013 at 12:22 AM and wrote "We still on." This cellular telephone number is listed under the contact name "Nigga Dis" in Mr. Lloyd's cellphone contacts. There was no response to the text. When Mr. Hernandez was at the station on



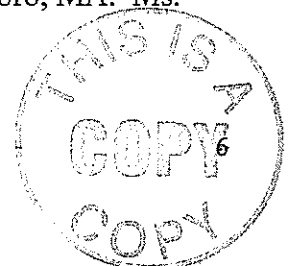
June 17, 2013, he had a cellular telephone in his possession and an investigator dialed the number [REDACTED]. The phone was observed to ring and Mr. Hernandez was seen and heard to answer the phone. The investigator hung up without speaking to Mr. Hernandez. Subsequent to the 12:22 AM text, the victim called the same number [REDACTED] at 12:50 AM, and at 1:03 AM. The text "we still on" indicated that the victim and Mr. Hernandez had made prior plans to do something. One of the last messages sent by the victim was sent to his sister, Shaquilla Thibou. Ms. Thibou saw Mr. Lloyd get into a silver-colored sedan and depart 10 Fayston Street, Dorchester between 1 and 2 AM on June 17, 2013. At 3:07 AM Mr. Lloyd texted Ms. Thibou "U saw who I'm with" and again at 3:11 AM "hello." At 3:19 AM the victim's sister replied "my phone was dead who was that?" The victim replied to his sister "Nfl." According to Ms. Thibou, Mr. Lloyd was recently associating with "Hernandez" a New England Patriot football player. She understood this text to mean that Mr. Lloyd was with Aaron "Hernandez." Ms. Thibou replied at 3:22 AM "Lol your aggy." The last text sent by the victim was at 3:23 AM. This text immediately followed the "Nfl" text. Mr. Lloyd described he was giving Ms. Lloyd this information "just so u know."

JOHN MEDEIROS

John Medeiros a residence of East Providence Rhode Island, who is an employee of Needle Tech in North Attleboro reported to Detective Daniel Arrighi of the North Attleboro Police Department that on the morning of June 17, 2013, he was at his place of employment. This is located at 452 John Dietsch Boulevard, and is approximately 200 yards from the scene. Mr. Medeiros reported that he took his regularly scheduled break between 3:00 and 3:30 AM. While he was on his break he sat in his vehicle in the parking lot. He reported to Det. Arrighi that he heard (3) gunshots and a car door slamming.

SHAQUILLA THIBOU

Tprs. Chad Laliberte and Zack Johnson interviewed Mr. Lloyd's sister. She indicated that she lived with her brother at 10 Fayston St. Apt. #2, Boston, MA. Ms. Thibou indicated that she last saw her brother at or between 1:00 to 2:00 AM in front of 10 Fayston Street. According to Ms. Thibou, Mr. Lloyd got into a silver four door car with three other males whose identities were unknown to her. The vehicle and the occupants left the area. Ms. Thibou told investigators that she had never seen this car before. According to Ms. Thibou, she was aware that Mr. Lloyd was dating a woman named Shaneah. Ms. Thibou stated that Shaneah was the sister of Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend, Shayanna Jenkins, who lives with Hernandez in North Attleboro, MA. Ms.



Thibou stated that, other than Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins, she did not know of any other contacts that Mr. Lloyd has in the North Attleboro area.

Ms. Thibou showed investigators some of the text messages that her brother had sent to her. These messages were explained to investigators and are described above in this affidavit. Ms. Thibou explained that her response to her brother stating "lol your aggy." She indicated that this meant that she was aggravated by her brother's text.

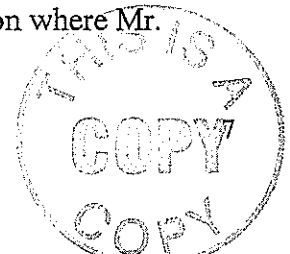
SHANEAH JENKINS

Tpr. Benson conducted a phone interview with Shaneah Jenkins, the victim's girlfriend. According to Shaneah Jenkins she did not know Mr. Lloyd to have any connection to North Attleboro other than her sister Shayanna Jenkins and Mr. Hernandez. She stated that Mr. Lloyd was her boyfriend and that they were presently in a long distance dating relationship of approximately one year.

ENTERPRISE RENTAL NORTH ATTLEBORO

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013 at approximately 10:00 AM, investigators arrived at Enterprise Rental Company located at 365 East Washington St., North Attleboro, MA. Investigators spoke with the Enterprise Rental manager who indicated that he was familiar with Aaron Hernandez due to the fact that he frequently rented vehicles from Enterprise Rental. The manager informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez came to Enterprise Rental on Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 5:30 PM. At this time, Mr. Hernandez was accompanied by two additional unknown males. Mr. Hernandez returned a rental vehicle which had been rented in his name. This vehicle was a silver colored 2012 Nissan Altima, Ma. Registration [REDACTED] At this time Aaron Hernandez rented another rental vehicle, a grey Chrysler 300C, bearing Rhode Island registration [REDACTED] According to the manager, Mr. Hernandez apologized for damage done to the driver's side exterior mirror and driver's door of the silver Nissan Altima. Although he apologized for the damage, Mr. Hernandez claimed that he did not know how the damage occurred. He said that he just came out in the morning and saw that it was damaged.

The Nissan Altima was viewed by investigators at the Enterprise Rental lot in North Attleboro. Investigators observed that there was damage to the driver's side front door. The driver's side mirror was mangled at the connection to the door and the mirror and housing were missing. Further, there was damage to the driver's side window and a chrome strip at the window. There were scratches on the driver's side door. There appeared to be soil, similar in color and appearance to that at the location where Mr.



Lloyd was found, on the tires and lower panels of the vehicle behind the tires. This soil was also seen within the tire tread(s) and wheel(s) well of the tires of the silver Nissan Altima.

Mass State Police Investigators viewed the tire treads and the tire treads appears to be consistent with the tire marks left at the scene where the body of Mr. Lloyd was recovered.

Enterprise Rental Car consented to provide the Nissan Altima rental to the Massachusetts State Police. The Nissan Altima is currently in the possession of the Massachusetts State Police.

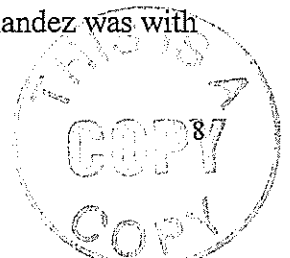
CONCLUSION

Based on the preceding, investigators believe that there is probable cause to believe that a crime was committed and that Mr. Lloyd's death was a homicide.

The cellular phone communications, text messages between the victim and Mr. Hernandez, the statement of Mr. Hernandez to investigators and the observations of Ms. Thibou show that Mr. Lloyd intended to meet and did meet with Mr. Hernandez on or about the morning on June 17, 2013. Based on information provided by the victim's sister and his girlfriend Mr. Lloyd appears to have no contacts with anybody in the North Attleboro area except for Mr. Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins.

The location where the body of Mr. Lloyd was located is approximately one half mile from Mr. Hernandez's residence at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma.

Based upon the information contained within the affidavit it is reasonable to believe that the purpose of Mr. Lloyd being in North Attleboro, MA at the time of his death was directly related to Mr. Hernandez. Furthermore it is reasonable to believe that Mr. Lloyd may have been in the area 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr., North Attleboro. Based on the statements of Mr. Hernandez and Ms. Jenkins, the surveillance system located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro captured the comings and goings of Mr. Hernandez and anyone else with him or in addition to him from the area surrounding the residence. This information can be used to establish timelines and lead to the discovery of other witnesses that may have been present and captured on the video system. Based upon Ms. Thibou's statement that she had witnessed Mr. Lloyd with (3) males earlier in the evening entering a silver car in front of the residence in Boston, combined with the text indicating "Nfl" and Mr. Hernandez's own acknowledgment that he was with Mr. Lloyd "up his way" lead investigators reasonably believe that Aaron Hernandez was with



Mr. Lloyd close in time to Mr. Lloyd's death. Additionally, based upon the information from Enterprise Rental that Mr. Hernandez had rented and subsequently returned a damaged silver Nissan Altima with tire treads consistent with the tire tread patterns at the scene of the homicide, investigators reasonably believe that the video surveillance system will contain evidence that can assist investigators in determining who was present with Mr. Lloyd and Mr. Hernandez during the evening and early morning prior to and following the death of Mr. Lloyd. This information will assist investigators with providing additional leads and evidence.

Based upon the above, there is probable cause to believe that evidence related to death of Odin Lloyd will be located within the home video surveillance system at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma. This affiant respectfully requests that the court issue a warrant and order allowing investigators to enter and search for and seize the video surveillance system as described by Ms. Jenkins. Furthermore, this affiant requests that the court authorize investigators to seize any electronic data stored as part of the video surveillance system to include but not limited to hard drives, external storage devices, compact discs, computers, laptops, flash drives or any other data storage device used for storing and viewing video data from the residential surveillance system.

The address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA is described as a three story, brick front, wood frame house with the numbers 22 on the mail box. The mailbox is located adjacent to the street next to the driveway. There is a pair of wooden doors leading into the front of the residence which faces Ronald C. Meyer Dr. There is a three car garage attached to the residence leading to the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma.

Additionally this affiant is requesting the court authorize investigators to search for and seize a cellular phone with the phone number of [REDACTED].


This affiant is requesting the court authorize investigator to conduct an "ALL PERSONS PRESENT" search for the cellular phone of [REDACTED]. Investigators are aware that by issuing an all persons present warrant, this will allow investigators to search for a cellular telephone on any person present within the residence that may have the phone contained in small pockets, purses, or loose clothing. Due to the size of cellular telephones it is easy for a person to secret a phone in various areas of their person and their clothing. This particular type of warrant will allow investigators to conduct a thorough and complete search for evidence of a cellular phone which may contain evidence of a homicide.



This affiant is requesting the court authorize investigators to search for and seize any and all Global Positioning Systems (GPS) as described by Mr. Hernandez as having been used to locate the residence of Mr. Lloyd. GPS tracking devices are known to be contained within any electronic device with GPS capability.

This affiant is requesting the court allow investigators to search and seize 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma. for mirror, housing of mirror, paint and any evidence of damage to the silver Nissan Altima occurring at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma.



1. I am an Assistant District Attorney;
2. I am assigned to the investigation of the homicide of Odin Lloyd which occurred in North Attleboro on or about June 17, 2013;
3. This investigation into this homicide is active and ongoing. The investigation is likely to be ongoing for an extended period of time and will include the use of the Bristol County Grand Jury;
4. The search warrants that are the subject of this motion describe the focus of the investigation as well as the Commonwealth's view of the evidence which led to the issuance of the warrant;
5. In my experience and the experience of other investigators, the destruction of physical evidence and/or the possibility that witness information will be altered is inherent in an investigation of this type and the risk of either of these occurrences would be increased if the information contained in these warrants, returns, affidavits, applications and these motions is publicly released;
6. Consequently, release of this information would interfere with the Commonwealth's ability to continued to obtain information relevant and material to the investigation; and
7. Because of the non-public nature of the Commonwealth's request, the fact of the on-going investigation, the possibility that the investigation will be harmed if the information is released and the use of the powers of the Grand Jury in this request, the Commonwealth believes that all materials submitted with this motion should be Sealed and Impounded.

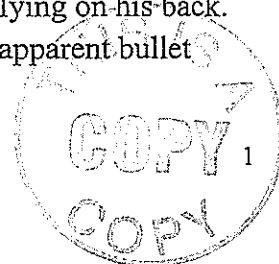
I, Michael F. Cherven, being duly sworn, hereby depose and say that: I am a Trooper with the Massachusetts State Police with the rank of Trooper. I have been a ~~member of the Massachusetts State Police since May 1996, and have been assigned to a~~ number of duty stations within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts as a uniformed state trooper. I have also been assigned to the State Fire Marshal's office where I investigated hundreds of explosives related cases including bombings, arson and murders.

In January of 2007, I was assigned to the Massachusetts State Police Detective Unit of Bristol County, an assignment that I currently hold. My duties include, but are not limited to, the investigation of various major crimes, including homicides, motor vehicle homicides, narcotics, rapes, internet based crimes and other violent crimes.

Based on my training and experience, and the collective knowledge of the other officers that I have worked with on this investigation as noted in my affidavit, I believe that a homicide occurred in the area of 344 John Dietch Boulevard, North Attleboro Ma.

The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant are as follows:

On Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 5:37 PM, North Attleboro Police Department responded to a cellular 911 call reporting a dead body behind 344 John Dietsch Boulevard North Attleboro, MA. North Attleboro Police responded to a secluded area behind 344 John Dietsch Boulevard and located a deceased male lying on his back. Upon inspection of the body, initial responding officers noted several apparent bullet



holes in the upper torso area of the unknown deceased black male. There was a small amount of blood in the area of the gunshot wounds. Next to the body officers observed (5) .45 caliber pistol casings. No firearm was found. Based on the physical evidence and a statement of a witness who heard gunshots as described later in this affidavit, investigators believe that a shooting occurred at this location. A subsequent search of the body found a Massachusetts drivers license in the name of Odin L. Lloyd, DOB: 11/14/1985 of 10 Fayston St., Apt. #2, Boston, MA. License photograph matched the deceased. Also located in the front right pants pocket of Mr. Lloyd were two sets of keys for an Enterprise Rental vehicle, bearing Rhode Island registration [REDACTED]. The keychain indicated that the registration belonged to a 2013 Chevrolet Suburban, color black.

CELL PHONE SEARCH

A cellular telephone was located in the right front sweatshirt pocket of Mr. Lloyd. This cellular telephone is a model HTC 1, with an assigned telephone number of [REDACTED]. This cellular telephone was seized by investigators and a search was conducted of the phone to search for information related to the death of Mr. Lloyd. During the search of the phone, recent activity was recovered and exported. The recent activity included call logs and text messages that were sent and received.

\$64.75 in cash was located in the back left pants pocket of Mr. Lloyd. In the opposite back right pants pocket were miscellaneous cards and personal items.

In the immediate vicinity of Mr. Lloyd's body, investigators observed a set of apparent automobile tire tracks that appeared to be a recent. The area surrounding Mr. Lloyd's body is used as a processing area for construction materials such as dirt, gravel, stone, asphalt, and fill. No vehicle was observed at the location of Mr. Lloyd's body.

RENTAL VEHICLE

A check of Enterprise Rental Car at TF Green airport in Rhode Island showed the vehicle described on the keys in the pocket of Mr. Lloyd ([REDACTED]) was currently being rented by Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. A check of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles shows an Aaron Hernandez, DOB: 11-06-1989 with a listed address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA.

Two Massachusetts State Police Troopers drove to 10 Fayston Street, Boston, MA. Their purpose was to make a death notification and interview Mr. Lloyd's friends and family members who may be associated with that address. Upon their arrival at 10 Fayston Street, these Troopers observed the Chevrolet Suburban backed into the yard of

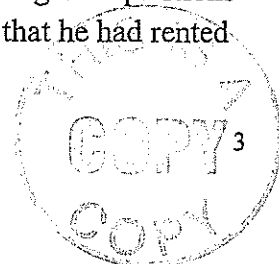


10 Fayston Street, behind a chain link fence. Massachusetts State Police Troop H dispatcher Bradley also made contact with Onstar. Onstar is a vehicle recovery tool that is used in many Chevrolet motor vehicles. Onstar indicated that they could assist police in locating the Chevrolet Suburban with Rhode Island registration [REDACTED] by employing its onboard Onstar system. The Onstar representative was informed that police believe it was necessary to locate the missing vehicle because occupants may be in danger due to the ongoing homicide investigation. Onstar representatives provided a location of 18 Fayston St. Boston, MA. This is in the immediate vicinity of Mr. Llyod's residence, 10 Fayston St. Boston, MA.

Separate from this activity, Detective Daniel Arrighi of the North Attleboro Police Department and this affiant drove to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. Upon the officers' arrival they were unable to make initial contact with any occupants inside the residence. Officers observed three (3) large surveillance cameras permanently fixed to the exterior of the residence. Det. Arrighi and I observed that the television was on inside the residence along with numerous lights. There were some drinking glasses on the couch and a bottle was tipped over in front of the television on the couch. However, ~~no occupants came to the door when the doorbell was used to summon the occupants.~~ Police having learned that the deceased Mr. Lloyd and the occupant of the house, Mr. Hernandez, were both connected to the then missing Chevrolet Suburban, these officers had concern for the safety of Mr. Hernandez. The officers walked to the rear of the house using flashlights to determine if there was any forced entry or if there was sign of any occupant. No signs of forced entry or occupants were observed.

The officers knocked on a neighbor's door and spoke with the occupants. These neighbors indicated that they knew Mr. Hernandez. One of the occupants identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots, Joe Judge. Mr. Judge indicated that he had last seen Mr. Hernandez on Thursday, June 13, 2013 after releasing Mr. Hernandez from practice along with other members of the New England Patriots. Mr. Judge did not have any contact information for Mr. Hernandez and was unable to provide us with any ~~information as to his whereabouts. Mr. Judge told this affiant that Aaron Hernandez is a~~ player for the New England Patriots.

At approximately 10:30 PM these officers were parked on the street in front of Mr. Hernandez's residence when they observed Mr. Hernandez exit the residence and walk down the driveway towards them. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had seen the officers in front of the house parked on the street through the video surveillance system. Det. Arrighi and I identified ourselves to Mr. Hernandez and began asking him questions about the black Chevy Suburban he had rented. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had rented

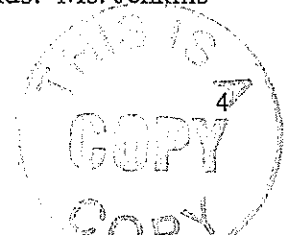


the vehicle for his friend "O". I asked who "O" was and Mr. Hernandez replied "Odin". I asked Mr. Hernandez how he knew Odin and he stated that his girlfriend's sister was dating Odin. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle from the Enterprise rental company on Rt. 1 in North Attleboro, MA. I asked when the last time he saw Odin was and he replied that he last saw Odin "up his way yesterday," indicating that he saw him last on Sunday, June 16, 2013 in Boston. Mr. Hernandez was unable to provide me a location where this was; however, he stated that he had the address saved on his GPS. Mr. Hernandez described that he observed us outside of his home on his video surveillance system. Mr. Hernandez then became argumentative with both Det. Arrighi and I and asked "what's with all the questions." He then stated that we would need to speak with his attorney. Mr. Hernandez then entered his residence, locking the door behind him, and he retrieved a business card for his attorney. Mr. Hernandez unlocked the door and handed the card to these officers. We informed Mr. Hernandez that this was a death investigation. Mr. Hernandez slammed the door and relocked it behind him. Mr. Hernandez did not ask officers whose death was being investigated. Mr. Hernandez's demeanor did not indicate any concern for the death of any person. Contact was then made with Mr. Hernandez's attorney.

SHAYANNA JENKINS

These officers returned to our vehicle. At approximately 10:40 PM while we remained parked in front of Mr. Hernandez's residence, Mr. Hernandez exited his residence and stated he would follow us to the police station to speak with us. Mr. Hernandez stated that his girlfriend would give him a ride. We followed Mr. Hernandez and his girlfriend to the North Attleboro Police Station which he entered. Mr. Hernandez's girlfriend then drove away from the police station. I followed her out of the lot and flashed my blue lights off and on and the vehicle pulled over adjacent to the North Attleboro Police Department. Det. Arrighi and I then spoke with the driver, identified as Ms. Shayanna Jenkins, DOB: 05-29-1989. I informed Ms. Jenkins about the death of Mr. Lloyd and she immediately began to cry. I asked her if she would speak to us in the parking lot of the Police Station. She agreed to speak there because her child was sleeping in the back seat of the vehicle.

Ms. Jenkins stated that she is the girlfriend of Aaron Hernandez and that they both live together at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. in North Attleboro. Ms. Jenkins stated that Mr. Lloyd dates her sister Shaneah Jenkins. Ms. Jenkins stated that she is not very familiar with Mr. Lloyd and that she does not know his family or any of his friends. Ms. Jenkins



stated that the connection between Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd is through her sister Shaneah. Ms. Jenkins stated that she last saw Mr. Lloyd on Saturday, June 15, 2013 at approximately 10:30 AM. Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd were both at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. in the black Suburban rental vehicle. Ms. Jenkins stated that Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd discussed returning the rental vehicle to Enterprise Rental.

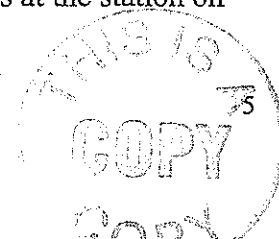
Ms. Jenkins indicated that she was aware that Mr. Lloyd smoked marijuana and that he also was a marijuana dealer. Ms. Jenkins stated that she would often observe Mr. Lloyd on his phone talking about marijuana sales. She stated that his phone was constantly ringing and that he was constantly talking in "lingo" that led her to believe the conversations were about marijuana sales. Ms. Jenkins provided investigators with the cell phone number for Mr. Hernandez as well as her sister Shaneah Jenkins. Ms. Jenkins also stated that Mr. Hernandez's cell phone number is [REDACTED]

Ms. Jenkins stated they had recently installed a video surveillance system within their residence. Ms. Jenkins stated that this video surveillance system would allow for the viewing of both the front of their residence as well as the street. Ms. Jenkins stated that the video surveillance system records and plays the video on their home entertainment system. Ms. Jenkins stated that there had been several recent break-in attempts at their residence located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma.

Ms. Jenkins stated that both she and Mr. Hernandez were home on Sunday, June 16, 2013 during the day. She stated that they had gone out to dinner for Father's Day later in the day and that a babysitter had stayed with their child. Ms. Jenkins stated that later that evening she had gone to bed early. However, she stated that she was aware that Mr. Hernandez was not home all night and that she was unsure of what time he got home or who he had gone out with. At this time during our conversation Mr. Hernandez called her on her cell phone and informed her that his sports agent said that she should not speak with us and that she should request to speak with her attorney.

ODIN LLOYD CELL PHONE

The cellular telephone recovered from the body of Mr. Lloyd was taken by investigators to the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators conducted a search of Mr. Lloyd's cellular phone at the police station. According to the cellular call logs Mr. Lloyd sent a text message to [REDACTED] (Mr. Hernandez's cell phone as provided by his girlfriend) on June 17, 2013 at 12:22 AM and wrote "We still on." This cellular telephone number is listed under the contact name "Nigga Dis" in Mr. Lloyd's cellphone contacts. There was no response to the text. When Mr. Hernandez was at the station on



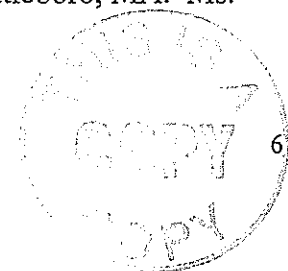
June 17, 2013, he had a cellular telephone in his possession and an investigator dialed the number [REDACTED]. The phone was observed to ring and Mr. Hernandez was seen and heard to answer the phone. The investigator hung up without speaking to Mr. Hernandez. Subsequent to the 12:22 AM text, the victim called the same number [REDACTED] at 12:50 AM, and at 1:03AM. The text "we still on" indicated that the victim and Mr. Hernandez had made prior plans to do something. One of the last messages sent by the victim was sent to his sister, Shaquilla Thibou. Ms. Thibou saw Mr. Lloyd get into a silver-colored sedan and depart 10 Fayston Street, Dorchester between 1 and 2 AM on June 17, 2013. At 3:07 AM Mr. Lloyd texted Ms. Thibou "U saw who I'm with" and again at 3:11AM "hello." At 3:19 AM the victim's sister replied "my phone was dead who was that?" The victim replied to his sister "Nfl." According to Ms. Thibou, Mr. Lloyd was recently associating with "Hernandez" a New England Patriot football player. She understood this text to mean that Mr. Lloyd was with Aaron "Hernandez." Ms. Thibou replied at 3:22 AM "Lol your aggy." The last text sent by the victim was at 3:23 AM. This text immediately followed the "Nfl" text. Mr. Lloyd described he was giving Ms. Lloyd this information "just so u know."

JOHN MEDEIROS

John Medeiros a residence of East Providence Rhode Island, who is an employee of Needle Tech in North Attleboro reported to Detective Daniel Arrighi of the North Attleboro Police Department that on the morning of June 17, 2013, he was at his place of employment. This is located at 452 John Dietsch Boulevard, and is approximately 200 yards from the scene. Mr. Medeiros reported that he took his regularly scheduled break between 3:00 and 3:30 AM. While he was on his break he sat in his vehicle in the parking lot. He reported to Det. Arrighi that he heard (3) gunshots and a car door slamming.

SHAQUILLA THIBOU

Tprs. Chad Laliberte and Zack Johnson interviewed Mr. Lloyd's sister. She indicated that she lived with her brother at 10 Fayston St. Apt. #2, Boston, MA. Ms. Thibou indicated that she last saw her brother at or between 1:00 to 2:00 AM in front of 10 Fayston Street. According to Ms. Thibou, Mr. Lloyd got into a silver four door car with three other males whose identities were unknown to her. The vehicle and the occupants left the area. Ms. Thibou told investigators that she had never seen this car before. According to Ms. Thibou, she was aware that Mr. Lloyd was dating a woman named Shaneah. Ms. Thibou stated that Shaneah was the sister of Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend, Shayanna Jenkins, who lives with Hernandez in North Attleboro, MA. Ms.



Thibou stated that, other than Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins, she did not know of any other contacts that Mr. Lloyd has in the North Attleboro area.

Ms. Thibou showed investigators some of the text messages that her brother had sent to her. These messages were explained to investigators and are described above in this affidavit. Ms. Thibou explained that her response to her brother stating "lol your aggy." She indicated that this meant that she was aggravated by her brother's text.

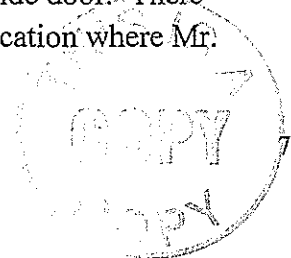
SHANEAH JENKINS

Tpr. Benson conducted a phone interview with Shanean Jenkins, the victim's girlfriend. According to Shanean Jenkins she did not know Mr. Lloyd to have any connection to North Attleboro other than her sister Shayanna Jenkins and Mr. Hernandez. She stated that Mr. Lloyd was her boyfriend and that they were presently in a long distance dating relationship of approximately one year.

ENTERPRISE RENTAL NORTH ATTLEBORO

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013 at approximately 10:00 AM, investigators arrived at Enterprise Rental Company located at 365 East Washington St., North Attleboro, MA. Investigators spoke with the Enterprise Rental manager who indicated that he was familiar with Aaron Hernandez due to the fact that he frequently rented vehicles from Enterprise Rental. The manager informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez came to Enterprise Rental on Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 5:30 PM. At this time, Mr. Hernandez was accompanied by two additional unknown males. Mr. Hernandez returned a rental vehicle which had been rented in his name. This vehicle was a silver colored 2012 Nissan Altima, Ma. Registration [REDACTED]. At this time Aaron Hernandez rented another rental vehicle, a grey Chrysler 300C, bearing Rhode Island registration [REDACTED]. According to the manager, Mr. Hernandez apologized for damage done to the driver's side exterior mirror and driver's door of the silver Nissan Altima. Although he apologized for the damage, Mr. Hernandez claimed that he did not know how the damage occurred. He said that he just came out in the morning and saw that it was damaged.

The Nissan Altima was viewed by investigators at the Enterprise Rental lot in North Attleboro. Investigators observed that there was damage to the driver's side front door. The driver's side mirror was mangled at the connection to the door and the mirror and housing were missing. Further, there was damage to the driver's side window and a chrome strip at the window. There were scratches on the driver's side door. There appeared to be soil, similar in color and appearance to that at the location where Mr.



Lloyd was found, on the tires and lower panels of the vehicle behind the tires. This soil was also seen within the tire tread(s) and wheel(s) well of the tires of the silver Nissan Altima.

Mass State Police Investigators viewed the tire treads and the tire treads appears to be consistent with the tire marks left at the scene where the body of Mr. Lloyd was recovered.

Enterprise Rental Car consented to provide the Nissan Altima rental to the Massachusetts State Police. The Nissan Altima is currently in the possession of the Massachusetts State Police.

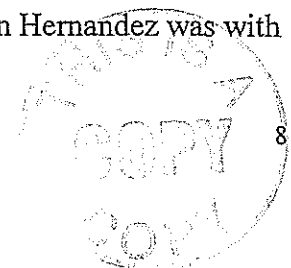
CONCLUSION

Based on the preceding, investigators believe that there is probable cause to believe that a crime was committed and that Mr. Lloyd's death was a homicide.

The cellular phone communications, text messages between the victim and Mr. Hernandez, the statement of Mr. Hernandez to investigators and the observations of Ms. Thibou show that Mr. Lloyd intended to meet and did meet with Mr. Hernandez on or about the morning on June 17, 2013. Based on information provided by the victim's sister and his girlfriend Mr. Lloyd appears to have no contacts with anybody in the North Attleboro area except for Mr. Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins.

The location where the body of Mr. Lloyd was located is approximately one half mile from Mr. Hernandez's residence at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma.

Based upon the information contained within the affidavit it is reasonable to believe that the purpose of Mr. Lloyd being in North Attleboro, MA at the time of his death was directly related to Mr. Hernandez. Furthermore it is reasonable to believe that Mr. Lloyd may have been in the area 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr., North Attleboro. Based on the statements of Mr. Hernandez and Ms. Jenkins, the surveillance system located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro captured the comings and goings of Mr. Hernandez and anyone else with him or in addition to him from the area surrounding the residence. This information can be used to establish timelines and lead to the discovery of other witnesses that may have been present and captured on the video system. Based upon Ms. Thibou's statement that she had witnessed Mr. Lloyd with (3) males earlier in the evening entering a silver car in front of the residence in Boston, combined with the text indicating "Nfl" and Mr. Hernandez's own acknowledgment that he was with Mr. Lloyd "up his way" lead investigators reasonably believe that Aaron Hernandez was with



Mr. Lloyd close in time to Mr. Lloyd's death. Additionally, based upon the information from Enterprise Rental that Mr. Hernandez had rented and subsequently returned a damaged silver Nissan Altima with tire treads consistent with the tire tread patterns at the scene of the homicide, investigators reasonably believe that the video surveillance system will contain evidence that can assist investigators in determining who was present with Mr. Lloyd and Mr. Hernandez during the evening and early morning prior to and following the death of Mr. Lloyd. This information will assist investigators with providing additional leads and evidence.

Based upon the above, there is probable cause to believe that evidence related to death of Odin Lloyd will be located within the home video surveillance system at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma. This affiant respectfully requests that the court issue a warrant and order allowing investigators to enter and search for and seize the video surveillance system as described by Ms. Jenkins. Furthermore, this affiant requests that the court authorize investigators to seize any electronic data stored as part of the video surveillance system to include but not limited to hard drives, external storage devices, compact discs, computers, laptops, flash drives or any other data storage device used for storing and viewing video data from the residential surveillance system.

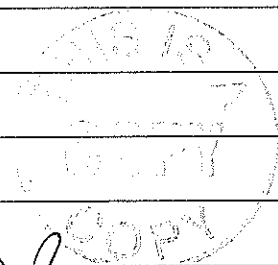

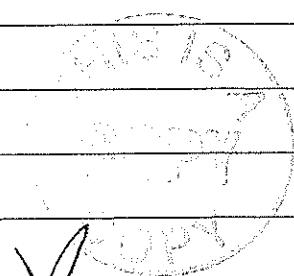



Affidavit in Support of Search Warrant

I, Trooper Eric J. Benson #3389, being duly sworn, depose and say: I am a Massachusetts State Police Trooper and have been so employed since September 2006. I am currently assigned to the Bristol County State Police Detective Unit attached to the Bristol County District Attorney's Office and have been so assigned since November of 2009.

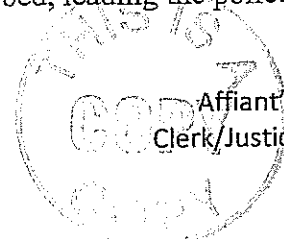
I have personal knowledge of the facts and circumstances related below, as the result of my own investigative efforts and those of other police officers who have reported their findings to me.

Based on my personal knowledge, I believe the crime of Murder, a violation of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 265, Section 1 was committed in an unimproved area in the vicinity of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro on or about Monday, June 17, 2013. The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant are as follows:

Initial Response

On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 5:37 p.m., the North Attleboro Police Department responded to a cellular 911 call reporting a dead body in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. The North Attleboro Police Department responded to a secluded area in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro and located a deceased male lying supine on the ground. The initial responding police officers observed several apparent gunshot wounds in the upper torso area of the then unidentified deceased black male. The initial responding officers further observed a small amount of blood in the area of the apparent gunshot wounds. The initial responding officers located five (5) .45 caliber discharged cartridge casings on the ground in the immediate area of the deceased male body. The initial responding officers did not observe a firearm in the area of the deceased male body. The initial responding officers observed a set of automobile tire tracks that appeared to have been recently made. The area where the deceased black male individual was found is remotely located and used as a processing area for construction materials such as dirt, gravel, stone, asphalt, and fill. The police did not observe any vehicles at the location where the black male individual was found deceased.

The police conducted a search of the body of the deceased black male individual during the processing of the crime scene on Monday, June 17, 2013. The police observed that the pants pockets of the deceased male individual appeared to be undisturbed, leading the police to believe

that no attempt had been made to remove items from the victim's pants pockets after the death of Odin Lloyd.

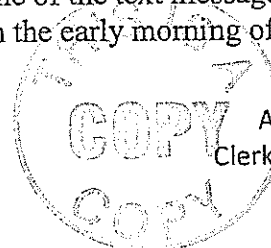
A wallet containing a Massachusetts Drivers License bearing the name Odin L. Lloyd (DOB: 11/14/1985) of 10 Fayston Street, Apt. # 2 in Boston inside the right rear pants pocket of the deceased black male. The photograph on Odin Lloyd's Massachusetts Driver's License matched the general physical appearance of the deceased male individual. Two sets of keys for a black 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] were located in the front right pants pocket of the deceased male individual presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. The keychain attached to the two sets of keys for the 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] indicated that the vehicle was owned by Enterprise Rent-A-Car. An HTC 1 cellular telephone was located in the right front sweatshirt pocket of the male individual presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. An amount of \$64.75 in loose cash was located in the back left pants pocket of Odin Lloyd.

The police contacted Enterprise Rent-A-Car at T.F. Green Airport in Rhode Island and learned that the vehicle described on the keys in the pocket of Odin Lloyd (2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED]) was currently being rented by Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. A check of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles database showed an Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-06-1989) with an address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

Next of Kin Notification and Preliminary Family Interviews

On the night of Monday, June 17, 2013, officers traveled to Odin Lloyd's residential address of 10 Fayston Street in Boston in order to attempt to make a death notification to his next of kin. Officers notified Odin Lloyd's next of kin and interviewed some of his friends and family members upon their arrival at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers observed Aaron Hernandez's rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban, the keys to which were found in Odin Lloyd's pocket, backed into the yard behind a chain link fence at 10 Fayston Street in Boston.

Officers interviewed Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou, following the death notification. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she lived with Odin Lloyd at 10 Fayston Street, Apt. #2, in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated that she last saw Odin Lloyd at or between 1:00 to 2:00 a.m. in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou went on to indicate that Odin Lloyd entered a silver, four door car with three other males whose identities she did not know. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that the silver vehicle and the occupants left the area after Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle. Shaquilla Thibou told investigators that she had never seen this silver car before. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated Odin Lloyd was dating a woman named Shaneah. Shaquilla Thibou explained that Shaneah was the sister of Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend, Shayanna Jenkins. Shaquilla Thibou stated that, other than Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins, she did not know of any other contacts that Odin Lloyd had in the North Attleboro area. Shaquilla Thibou showed investigators some of the text messages that her brother had sent to her after he entered the silver vehicle on the early morning of Monday, June

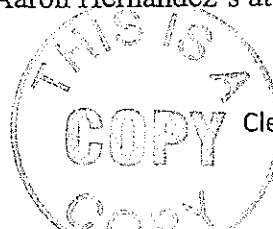
17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou explained these text messages to investigators and are described below in this affidavit.

Initial contact with Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins

Officers traveled to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro and attempted to make contact with the occupants of the residence on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers were initially unable to make contact with any of the residents of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. While attempting to make contact, officers observed three (3) large surveillance cameras permanently affixed to the exterior of the residence. Officers also observed that the television and numerous lights were on inside the residence. Despite repeated efforts to summons the occupants, no one came to the door of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Based on the totality of the circumstances that brought the police to the residence and the inability of the police to make contact with the residents, the officers went to the rear of the 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro to determine if there was any forced entry or sign of the occupants. No signs of forced entry or the occupants were observed.

The officers then proceeded to a neighboring residence and spoke with the occupants. The neighbors indicated that they knew Aaron Hernandez, one of whom identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots. That individual indicated that he had last seen Aaron Hernandez, a player for the New England Patriots, at football practice on Thursday, June 13, 2013. The individual did not have any contact information for Aaron Hernandez and was unable to provide any information as to the whereabouts of Aaron Hernandez.

These same officers returned to their vehicle and were parked on the street in front of Aaron Hernandez's residence when they observed Aaron Hernandez exit his residence and walk down the driveway in their direction at approximately 10:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez told the officers that he had seen them parked in front of the house through his video surveillance system. The officers identified themselves and asked Aaron Hernandez questions about the Chevrolet Suburban he had rented. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle for his friend "O." When asked who "O" was, Aaron Hernandez replied "Odin." When asked how he knew Odin, Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend's sister was dating Odin. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle from Enterprise Rent-A-Car on Route 1 in North Attleboro. When asked when he last saw Odin, Aaron Hernandez replied that he last saw Odin "up his way yesterday," indicating that he saw Odin last in Boston on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Although Aaron Hernandez was unable to provide the officers with the location where he last saw Odin, he stated that he saved the address in his GPS. Aaron Hernandez then became argumentative with the officers, and asked: "what's with all the questions?" Aaron Hernandez then stated that the police would need to speak with his attorney. Aaron Hernandez entered his residence, locking the door behind him, and retrieved a business card for his attorney. Aaron Hernandez then unlocked the door and handed his attorney's business card to the officers. When the officers told Aaron Hernandez that they were conducting a death investigation, Aaron Hernandez slammed the door and locked it behind him. Aaron Hernandez did not ask the officers whose death was being investigated nor did he display any outward signs of concern. Contact was then made with Aaron Hernandez's attorney.

The officers returned to their vehicle once again. Shortly after the officers returned to their vehicle, Aaron Hernandez exited his residence and stated that he would follow the officers to the police station to speak with the police. Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) would give him a ride to the police station. The officers followed Aaron Hernandez and his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) to the North Attleboro Police Department. Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) drove away after dropping Aaron Hernandez off at the North Attleboro Police Department. Officers followed Shayanna Jenkins out of the parking lot and stopped Shayanna Jenkins' vehicle adjacent to the North Attleboro Police Department. Officers then spoke with Shayanna Jenkins (DOB: 05/29/1989). Officers informed Shayanna Jenkins about the death of Odin Lloyd and she immediately began to cry. Shayanna Jenkins agreed to speak to the officers where her vehicle had been stopped because her child was sleeping in the back seat of the vehicle.

Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and her boyfriend, Aaron Hernandez, live together at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. in North Attleboro. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd was in a dating relationship with her sister, Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was not very familiar with Odin Lloyd and claimed not to know Odin Lloyd's family or any of Odin Lloyd's friends. Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd knew each other through Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she last saw Odin Lloyd at approximately 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez were both inside the black Chevrolet Suburban at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd discussed returning the rental vehicle to Enterprise Rent-A-Car.

~~Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Odin Lloyd smoked marijuana and was also a marijuana dealer.~~ Shayanna Jenkins stated that she would often observe Odin Lloyd on his phone talking about marijuana sales. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Odin Lloyd's phone was constantly ringing and that he was constantly talking in "lingo," leading her to believe the conversations were about marijuana sales. Shayanna Jenkins provided investigators with the cellular telephone numbers for Aaron Hernandez her sister Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number was [REDACTED] [When Aaron Hernandez was at the North Attleboro Police Department on June 17, 2013, he had a cellular telephone in his possession and an investigator dialed the number [REDACTED]. The phone was observed to ring and Aaron Hernandez answered the phone. The investigator hung up without speaking to Aaron Hernandez.]

Shayanna Jenkins stated they had recently installed a video surveillance system within their residence. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that this video surveillance system would allow for the viewing of both the front of their residence as well as the street. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that the video surveillance system records and plays the video on their home entertainment system. Shayanna Jenkins stated that there had been several recent break-in attempts at their residence.

Shayanna Jenkins further stated that both she and Aaron Hernandez were home during the day on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that they had gone out to dinner for Father's Day later in the day and that a babysitter had stayed with their infant child. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that she had gone to bed early but Aaron Hernandez had gone out on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was unsure who Aaron Hernandez had gone out with or what time Aaron Hernandez came home on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013 into Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez called Shayanna Jenkins on her cellular telephone while she was speaking with the police and informed her that his sports agent said that she should not speak with the police and that she should request to speak with her attorney.

Search of Odin Lloyd's Cellular Telephone

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone was searched for information related to the death of Odin Lloyd at the North Attleboro Police Department. During the search of the HTC 1 cellular telephone, officers learned that Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone was assigned to telephone number [REDACTED]. The police learned that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number, [REDACTED] appeared as "Nigga Dis" and "Dis Nigga" in Mr. Lloyd's cellular telephone contacts. The analysis of Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone revealed that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez engaged in extensive text and voice cellular telephone communication on June 16, 2013 and June 17, 2013. On June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:05 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "I'm coming to grab that tonight u gon b around I need dat and we could step for a little again [sic]." Odin Lloyd did not immediately respond to Aaron Hernandez's text message. On June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:34 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "Waddup." On June 16, 2013, at 9:37 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite (meaning alright), where." On June 16, 2013, at 9:39 p.m., Aaron Hernandez responded: "idk (meaning I don't know) it don't matter but imma hit u when I'm dat way like Las time if my phone dies imma hit u when I charge it which will be in a lil [sic]." On June 16, 2013, at 10:00 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite idk anything goin on [sic]" Aaron Hernandez's last text message to Odin Lloyd was at 10:13 p.m. on June 16, 2013 and read: "I'll figure it out ill hit u on way." On June 16, 2013, at 12:22 a.m., Odin Lloyd sent his last text to Aaron Hernandez: "We still on." Odin Lloyd's call records show no further contact, via phone, with Aaron Hernandez.

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone recent call logs revealed that Odin Lloyd had received five (5) phone calls from telephone number [REDACTED] between 1:22 a.m. and 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The last incoming telephone call on Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone was from [REDACTED] at 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators called phone number [REDACTED] several times on Tuesday, June 18, 2013 in an attempt to contact one of the last persons to have spoken to Odin Lloyd. The telephone associated with [REDACTED] was not answered on Tuesday, June 18, 2013. On Tuesday, June 18, 2013 Aaron Hernandez told investigators that a male named "BO" had a silver Chrysler that he (Aaron Hernandez) had rented. Aaron Hernandez further told investigators that he did not know BO's telephone number. On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, Trooper Joseph Collins retrieved Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone from an attorney who represented Aaron Hernandez. On

Tuesday, June 18, 2013, a search warrant authorizing a search of Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone assigned phone number [REDACTED] was issued by the Attleboro District Court. On June 19, 2013, investigators conducted a search of Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone assigned phone number [REDACTED] and located the name "BO" in his contact list. The telephone number associated with contact "BO" in Aaron Hernandez's telephone was [REDACTED]

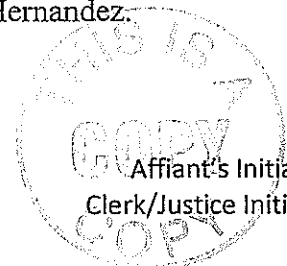
The last text messages sent by Odin Lloyd were sent to his sister, Shaquilla Thibou. On June 17, 2013, at 3:07 a.m. Odin Lloyd texted Shaquilla Thibou: "U saw who I'm with." On June 17, 2013, at 3:11 a.m., Odin Lloyd texted Shaquilla Thibou again: "hello." On June 17, 2013, at 3:19 a.m., Shaquilla Thibou replied: "my phone was dead who was that?" On June 17, 2013, at 3:22 a.m., Odin Lloyd replied to Shaquilla Thibou: "Nfl." Shaquilla Thibou told the police that Odin Lloyd was recently associating with "Hernandez," a New England Patriot football player. Shaquilla Thibou explained that she understood this text message to mean that Odin Lloyd was with Aaron "Hernandez." Shaquilla Thibou replied to Odin Lloyd by text message at 3:22 a.m. on June 17, 2013: "Lol your aggy." Shaquilla Thibou explained that her response to her brother stating "lol your aggy" meant that she was aggravated by her brother's text. The last text message sent by Odin Lloyd was at 3:23 a.m. on June 17, 2013 which read: "just so u know."

John Medeiros

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at 12:44 p.m., John Medeiros was interviewed at the North Attleboro Police Department. John Medeiros stated that he was working at Needle Tech Products Inc. located at 452 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro on the early morning of June 17, 2013. Needle Tech Products Inc. is approximately 200 yards from where Odin Lloyd was located deceased. John Medeiros stated that he took his regularly scheduled break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. John Medeiros further stated that he was sleeping in his vehicle in the parking lot of Needle Tech Products Inc. located at 452 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro during his break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. John Medeiros went on to say that he heard three (3) gunshots and a car door slamming approximately midway through his break on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013.

Shaneah Jenkins

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 1:05 a.m., the police interviewed Shaneah Jenkins by telephone. Shaneah Jenkins explained that she was Odin Lloyd's girlfriend of over one (1) year. Shaneah Jenkins became very emotional when she was informed that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins claimed that she had not previously known that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins stated that she did not know Odin Lloyd to have any connection to North Attleboro other than her sister, Shayanna Jenkins, and Aaron Hernandez.

Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 10:00 a.m., the police traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car located at 365 East Washington Street in North Attleboro. The police spoke with the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who indicated that he was familiar with Aaron Hernandez due to the fact that he frequently rented vehicles from Enterprise Rent-A-Car. The manager informed the police that Aaron Hernandez came to Enterprise Rent-A-Car with two unknown male individuals at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager indicated that Aaron Hernandez returned a silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that he had previously rented in his name. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez rented a grey Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] upon returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that Aaron Hernandez apologized for damage done to the driver's side exterior side view mirror and driver's door of the silver Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED]. The manager indicated that although Aaron Hernandez apologized for the damage, he claimed not to know how the damage occurred. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez explained that he just came out in the morning and saw that the vehicle was damaged.

The silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] was viewed by the police at the Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. Investigators observed that there was damage to the front driver's side door. Investigators also observed that the side view mirror on the driver's side was mangled at the connection to the door and the mirror and housing were missing. Investigators further observed damage to the driver's side window and a chrome strip at the driver's side window. There were also scratches on the driver's side door. Investigators observed soil, similar in color and appearance to that at the location where Odin Lloyd's body was found, on the tires and lower panels of the vehicle behind the tires. Similar soil was also seen within the tire tread(s) and wheel(s) well(s) of the tires of the silver Nissan Altima. Investigators also viewed the tire treads and the tire treads appear to be consistent with the tire marks left at the scene where the body of Odin Lloyd was found.

Enterprise Rent-A-Car consented to release the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] to the Massachusetts State Police. The 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] is currently in the possession of the Massachusetts State Police undergoing additional testing.

Shaquilla Thibou

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 4:14 p.m., Shaquilla Thibou was interviewed at the North Attleboro Police Department. Shaquilla Thibou was re-interviewed regarding the information she had concerning the last time she saw her brother alive. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she was speaking with her boyfriend in a car that was parked in the vicinity of her residence located at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that her cellular telephone battery had died at some point while seated in the car speaking with her boyfriend. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she witnessed a

silver four door sedan that she believed to be either a Nissan Altima, a Nissan Maxima, or a Toyota Camry pull up in front of her residence on Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle through the rear passenger door and the vehicle drove away from the area of 10 Fayston Street in North Attleboro. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she believed that there were three other individuals in addition to her brother within the vehicle.

Shaquilla Thibou stated that she entered her apartment and plugged her cellular telephone into a charger on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she received two text messages from Odin Lloyd after she plugged her cellular telephone into the charger. The time stamp on her cellular phone indicated "JUN 17, 2013, 3:07AM" Shaquilla Thibou used this time stamp as a reference to recall the approximate time that she had seen her brother get into the silver four door sedan. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she believed that the time that she last saw Odin Lloyd was approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 rather than the initial timeframe that she initially provided to the police.

Video Surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013 investigators executed a search warrant for 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. As a result of this search, digital video evidence was seized and reviewed by investigators from the home surveillance system. This video surveillance system was attached to fourteen (14) cameras both inside and outside of the residence.

The surveillance video from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows three male individuals exit the residence in the area of the garage at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The first two male individuals exit the residence together, while the third male individual exits the residence several seconds after the first two. The first male individual depicted on surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 bears a resemblance to Aaron Hernandez. Investigators believe this individual to be Aaron Hernandez. The individual believed to be Aaron Hernandez is wearing a light colored hooded sweatshirt, dark colored pants, and light colored footwear. The second male individual depicted on surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has dark complexion and is wearing a short sleeve light colored shirt, dark colored pants, dark colored sneakers. The third male individual depicted on surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has the darkest complexion of the three male individuals and is wearing a blue and white long sleeve shirt and dark colored pants. This third male individual appears to be carrying a light colored plastic bag in his right hand. All three individuals walk down the driveway towards the street and exit the view of the surveillance video. A short time later, a silver four door vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima reverses up the driveway and parks near the garage. The individual believed to be Aaron Hernandez exits the driver's seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima and approaches the garage. The male with the darkest complexion wearing a blue and white upper garment exits the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima and walks to the rear of the vehicle while apparently manipulating an object in his hands. This male individual with the darkest complexion wearing a blue and white upper

garment walks around the vehicle and opens the trunk through the open driver's side door after finding the trunk to be locked. This male individual with the darkest complexion wearing a blue and white upper garment then opens the trunk of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima and appears to manipulate objects in the trunk for several seconds. The male with the darkest complexion wearing a blue and white upper garment appears to hand the individual who is believed to be Aaron Hernandez a white rope-like item that he retrieved from the trunk of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The male believed to be Aaron Hernandez enters the apparent Nissan Altima with the white rope-like item. All three male individuals exited the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima and entered the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The three male individuals exited the garage and entered the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima at approximately 1:09 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The individual with the darkest complexion wearing a blue and white upper garment enters the driver's seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The individual believed to be Aaron Hernandez entered the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The third individual wearing a short sleeve light colored shirt, dark colored pants, dark colored sneakers enters the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima through the rear driver's side door. The vehicle then drives down the driveway and disappears from view of the surveillance system at approximately 1:09:48 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that the side view mirror on the driver's side of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima was still in place when the vehicle exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 1:09 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The video surveillance shows that the vehicle consistent with a silver Nissan Altima returns to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:26:56 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that the side view mirror on the driver's side of the apparent Nissan Altima was damaged when it entered the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:26:56 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Three male individuals exit the apparent silver Nissan Altima in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:27 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. A male individual bearing a strong resemblance to Aaron Hernandez exited the driver's seat of the apparent silver Nissan Altima. The individual believed to be Aaron Hernandez was wearing a light colored hooded sweatshirt, dark colored pants, and light colored footwear. A male individual with dark complexion wearing a blue and white long sleeve shirt and dark colored pants exited the front passenger seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. A male individual wearing dark colored shoes, dark colored pants, a white shirt, and a dark colored jacket exited the rear driver's seat of the apparent silver Nissan Altima. This male individual's left arm did not appear to be inside the arm hole of the dark colored jacket as he exited the vehicle and walked toward the residence. The three male individuals entered the garage area of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:27 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The interior video surveillance at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro showed the three male individuals entering the residence. Investigators are able to positively identify Aaron Hernandez from the interior surveillance footage as one of the three male individuals who entered the residence at approximately 3:27 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The second male

appears to be an older dark-skinned male with a larger stomach and short gray hair. This male walks to the basement door and enters the basement through the basement door. The third male individual was wearing a light colored, long sleeved upper garment. This third male stopped in the kitchen then turns away from the camera and pulls up a piece of his dark colored clothing covering his head a face from the camera. The surveillance video shows Aaron Hernandez and the two other male individuals enter the basement of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The surveillance video shows Aaron Hernandez enter and exit the basement on several different occasions while also going into other rooms within the residence. Aaron Hernandez is observed to be in and out of the basement on several different occasions while also going to other rooms within the residence. After about six minute of being in the residence, Aaron Hernandez is seen entering the basement for the final time. There is no activity seen until the recording stops after 3:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

On June, 20, 2013, investigators spoke with Michael Connors of Home-Tek Custom Design. Michael Connors installed the video surveillance system at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at the direction of Shayanna Jenkins. Among other things, Michael Connors told investigators that the surveillance system records the video of all cameras continuously unless a cable connecting a camera to the system is disconnected. Michael Connors stated that disconnecting a particular camera cable takes that camera off line while the system continues to record footage from the other connected cameras. Michael Connors further stated that he showed Aaron Hernandez how to disconnect specific cameras from the recording device in May of 2013. ~~Michael Connors went on to say that he clearly labeled the connections so that Aaron Hernandez could more easily disconnect cameras at locations within his home where and when he wanted to avoid surveillance recordings.~~

The surveillance video from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro revealed that the three males that entered the residence around 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 were wearing the following clothing (Refer to surveillance photographs in Addendum A, B and C):

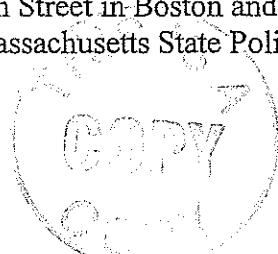
Male # 1 (Aaron Hernandez): White or light colored hooded long sleeve sweatshirt, black pants, and white sneakers. (Refer to Photograph # 1 in Addendum A)

Male # 2: Dark colored coat, a white shirt, and dark colored pants. (Refer to Photograph # 2 in Addendum B)

Male # 3: Long sleeve blue and white upper garment and dark colored pants. (Refer to Photograph # 3 in Addendum C)

Video Surveillance from 9 Fayston Street in Boston

Investigators learned from Boston Police Detectives that there was a video surveillance system at 9 Fayston Street in Boston. This residence is located across the street from Odin Lloyd's and Shaquilla Thibou's apartment at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Boston Police investigators spoke with the homeowner at 9 Fayston Street in Boston and obtained a copy of the surveillance footage for Monday, June 17, 2013. Massachusetts State Police investigators

reviewed the video surveillance footage and observed that at approximately 2:33 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013, a vehicle, identified by investigators as a silver colored Nissan Altima arrives in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. The video shows a male individual, believed to be the victim Odin Lloyd, enter into the rear passenger's side of the vehicle. [This information is consistent with information provided to the police by Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou.] Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the vehicle as it arrived at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Investigators were able to determine that once the door was opened, the interior light illuminated the interior of the vehicle, providing a better view of the occupants of the vehicle, including the operator of the Nissan Altima who was observed to be wearing a white shirt. Additionally, investigators observe that the Nissan Altima's driver's-side exterior mirror was intact and attached to the vehicle at that time.

Surveillance Video from John L. Dietsch Boulevard and Landry Avenue in North Attleboro

Investigators conducted a canvass in the area of the crime scene at 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard and learned that there were several surveillance cameras facing the area of John Dietsch Boulevard. Investigators viewed several surveillance cameras and learned the following:

255 John Deitsch Boulevard - Metalor Refinery: An inspection of the surveillance cameras revealed a vehicle traveling North on John L. Dietsch Boulevard towards the Crime Scene located at the rear of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard. This vehicle is observed to enter the secluded gravel construction area where the body of Odin Lloyd was located. This vehicle entered into the crime scene at the approximate time that John Medeiros reports hearing gunshots. Approximately (4) minutes later the same Metalor camera captures a vehicle leaving the Crime Scene and turning left out onto John L. Dietsch Boulevard towards 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive. Investigators are aware that the direction of travel is consistent with the vehicle coming from the area of Interstate 95.

500 John L. Dietsch Boulevard - Bells Powder Coating: Investigators inspected the surveillance video showing a vehicle travelling north from the direction of both the crime scene and Metalor Refinery also shortly after being captured on the video surveillance at Metalor Refinery.

275 Landry Ave. - North Attleboro Electric Department: Investigators inspected the surveillance video showing a vehicle turning left onto Landry Ave. from John Dietch Boulevard. This vehicle is captured heading West on Landry Ave. towards Westwood Estates, towards the direction of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro. This vehicle is captured in a short amount of time after having been captured by the surveillance cameras at Metalor Refinery, Bells Powder Coating and within the time estimated by John Medeiros.

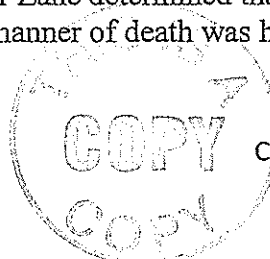
Search of the Dumpster on the Property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013, the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who had previously been interviewed by police contacted investigators with additional information. The manager indicated that she declined Aaron Hernandez's offer of Bubblicious Bubble Gum on the evening of Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager further indicated that she secured the keys to the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] in a safe inside Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013 into Tuesday, June 17, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that she cleaned the silver 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented at approximately 7:45 a.m. on Tuesday, June 17, 2013. The manager indicated that while cleaning the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented she located four items that she disposed of in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager further indicated that she located a small vitamin water bottle in the front driver's side cup holder of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager went on to indicate that she located what appeared to be a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing in the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager indicated that she found a piece of chewed blue bubble gum and a "bullet" underneath the child's drawing underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager further indicated that she used a piece of paper to pick up the piece of chewed blue bubble gum and the "bullet" from the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager also recalled that Aaron Hernandez produced Bubblicious Bubble Gum in a blue Bubblicious Bubble Gum wrapper and offered her a piece of gum while he was returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Officers immediately traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and secured the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers searched the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers located a bottle of Vitamin Water, a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, a piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and a spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers showed the manager photographs of the bottle of Vitamin Water, the piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, the piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and the spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing that were located inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager identified the items in the photographs as being the items that she removed from the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented and threw in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the morning of Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

Autopsy

On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, Doctor William Zane of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner conducted the autopsy of Odin Lloyd. Doctor Zane determined that Odin Lloyd's cause of death was gunshot wounds and Odin Lloyd's manner of death was homicide.

Ballistics

The State Police Firearms Identification Section analyzed the five (5) spent cartridge casings that were recovered from the area near where Odin Lloyd's body was discovered. The State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the five spent cartridge casings were all .45 caliber and were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

The .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro was sent to the State Police Firearms Identification Section for ballistic analysis. The State Police Firearms Identification Section compared the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro with the five spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body. The State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and the five (5) .45 caliber spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

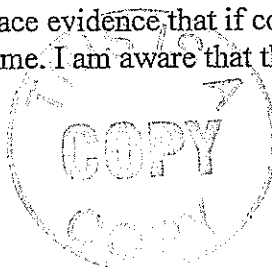
Several searches have been performed utilizing the State Police SERT Team, metal detectors, and police K-9's that are trained in the detection of firearms and ammunition in the area of the crime scene and in the area between the crime scene and 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro, but a .45 caliber firearm has not been recovered during the course of the investigation.

Conclusion

Based on the video evidence of 10 Fayston Street in Boston, the surveillance cameras on John L. Dietsch Boulevard, Landry Avenue, and at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro, investigators believe that the persons responsible for the murder of Odin Lloyd were traveling in a Nissan Altima, similar to the Nissan Altima rented by Aaron Hernandez. Based on the witness statements and the aforementioned video evidence along with the text messages from Odin Lloyd, investigators believe that Aaron Hernandez and two other male individuals were present at the location and time of the murder of Odin Lloyd.

Video evidence shows Aaron Hernandez and two other male individuals entering the residence of Aaron Hernandez at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro within a short time of the witness reports by John Medeiros having heard gunshots. These three individuals are subsequently observed on the interior surveillance cameras inside 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

I have personal knowledge, based upon experience and training, that crimes of violence often involve a struggle and the use of weapons or other instrumentalities. I also know that the person or persons participating in the commission of a violent offense are in contact with the physical surroundings and often leave evidence or trace evidence that if collected will help to identify the perpetrators and / or the nature of the crime. I am aware that there is often an attempt

to alter, destroy, remove, clean up, or cover up evidence of a crime. I am aware that evidence of a crime may be left in the form of gunshot residue, clothing, physiological fluids, palm prints, shoe prints, fibers, fingerprints, footprints, tire tread impressions, hair, saliva, semen, blood, firearms, pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns, ammunition, shell casings, projectiles, hatchets, axes, cutting instruments, knife and / or knives, cellular telephones, pieces of identification in print, photograph, or video that may identify any or all of the parties named in the investigation. I am also aware that many of these items are minute and/or microscopic, and are often referred to as trace and biological evidence and that specialized training and equipment is needed for the collection of such trace and biological evidence.

I therefore request that the court authorize a search of the above described residence, for trace/biological evidence including blood, serums, skin, clothing, gunshot residue, fingerprints, firearms, ammunition, DNA, clothing as described above and in Addendum "A," "B," and "C", shoes, shoeprints and any other evidence as described above to assist in the identification of a suspect or suspects, and that if any of the above evidence is found that it be seized as evidence and further analyzed or searched as necessary.

Additionally, I request that the court issue an "ALL PERSONS PRESENT" search warrant. An all persons present search warrant will allow investigators the ability to search all persons present who may have evidence of the crime of murder secreted on their person or within their pockets. The nature of the evidence investigators are searching for is both untraceable to the naked eye and also concealable within pockets, pants, purses and other concealment areas in clothing. Allowing for the all persons present warrant will ensure that investigators conduct a thorough search for evidence.

I am also aware that the perpetrator of a violent crime may remove evidence from the scene and conceal it or destroy it in an attempt to secret it from investigators. Often a perpetrator will return to his or her residence and discard items that he or she may not view as evidence. Such items could be clothing. Often perpetrators will return to his or her residence to change clothing in an attempt to alter his or her appearance. I am also aware that a perpetrator may leave evidence of a crime at his or her residence prior to the commission of that crime. This could include evidence that the perpetrator was in possession of a firearm or ammunition and may be stored in his or her residence. I request permission to video record and photograph the residence described in this affidavit.

Based on the aforementioned information provided in this affidavit, I have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crime of Murder, a violation of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 265, Section 1, will be located inside and / or on the property of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The structure located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro is more particularly described as a three story, brick front, wood frame house with the number 22 on the mail box. The mailbox is located adjacent to the street next to the driveway. There is a pair of wooden doors leading into the front of the residence which faces Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. There is a three car garage attached to the residence leading to the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

In January of 2007, I was assigned to the Massachusetts State Police Detective Unit of Bristol County, an assignment that I currently hold. My duties include, but are not limited to, the investigation of various major crimes, including homicides, motor vehicle homicides, narcotics, rapes, internet based crimes and other violent crimes.

Based on my training and experience, and the collective knowledge of the other officers that I have worked with on this investigation as noted in my affidavit, I believe that a homicide occurred in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard, North Attleboro Ma.

The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant are as follows:

On Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 5:37 PM, North Attleboro Police Department responded to a cellular 911 call reporting a dead body behind 344 John Dietsch Boulevard North Attleboro, MA. North Attleboro Police responded to a secluded area behind 344 John Dietsch Boulevard and located a deceased male lying on his back.



Upon inspection of the body, initial responding officers noted several apparent bullet holes in the upper torso area of the unknown deceased black male. There was a small amount of blood in the area of the gunshot wounds. Next to the body officers observed (5) .45 caliber pistol casings. No firearm was found. Based on the physical evidence and a statement of a witness who heard gunshots as described later in this affidavit, investigators believe that a shooting occurred at this location. A subsequent search of the body found a Massachusetts drivers license in the name of Odin L. Lloyd, DOB: 11/14/1985 of 10 Fayston St., Apt. #2, Boston, MA. License photograph matched the deceased. Also located in the front right pants pocket of Mr. Lloyd were two sets of keys for an Enterprise Rental vehicle, bearing Rhode Island registration [REDACTED]. The keychain indicated that the registration belonged to a 2013 Chevrolet Suburban, color black.

CELL PHONE SEARCH

A cellular telephone was located in the right front sweatshirt pocket of Mr. Lloyd. This cellular telephone is a model HTC 1, with an assigned telephone number of [REDACTED]. This cellular telephone was seized by investigators and a search was conducted of the phone to search for information related to the death of Mr. Lloyd. During the search of the phone, recent activity was recovered and exported. The recent activity included call logs and text messages that were sent and received.

\$64.75 in cash was located in the back left pants pocket of Mr. Lloyd. In the opposite back right pants pocket were miscellaneous cards and personal items.

In the immediate vicinity of Mr. Lloyd's body, investigators observed a set of apparent automobile tire tracks that appeared to be a recent. The area surrounding Mr. Lloyd's body is used as a processing area for construction materials such as dirt, gravel, stone, asphalt, and fill. No vehicle was observed at the location of Mr. Lloyd's body.

RENTAL VEHICLE

A check of Enterprise Rental Car at TF Green airport in Rhode Island showed the vehicle described on the keys in the pocket of Mr. Lloyd (RI Reg. [REDACTED]) was currently being rented by Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. A check of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles shows an Aaron Hernandez, DOB: 11-06-1989 with a listed address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA.



Two Massachusetts State Police Troopers drove to 10 Fayston Street, Boston, MA. Their purpose was to make a death notification and interview Mr. Lloyd's friends and family members who may be associated with that address. Upon their arrival at 10 Fayston Street, these Troopers observed the Chevrolet Suburban backed into the yard of 10 Fayston Street, behind a chain link fence. Massachusetts State Police Troop H dispatcher Bradley also made contact with Onstar. Onstar is a vehicle recovery tool that is used in many Chevrolet motor vehicles. Onstar indicated that they could assist police in locating the Chevrolet Suburban with Rhode Island registration [REDACTED] by employing its onboard Onstar system. The Onstar representative was informed that police believe it was necessary to locate the missing vehicle because occupants may be in danger due to the ongoing homicide investigation. Onstar representatives provided a location of 18 Fayston St. Boston, MA. This is in the immediate vicinity of Mr. Lloyd's residence, 10 Fayston St. Boston, MA.

Separate from this activity, Detective Daniel Arrighi of the North Attleboro Police Department and this affiant drove to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. Upon the officers' arrival they were unable to make initial contact with any occupants inside the residence. Officers observed three (3) large surveillance cameras permanently fixed to the exterior of the residence. Det. Arrighi and I observed that the television was on inside the residence along with numerous lights. There were some drinking glasses on the couch and a bottle was tipped over in front of the television on the couch. However, no occupants came to the door when the doorbell was used to summon the occupants. Police having learned that the deceased Mr. Lloyd and the occupant of the house, Mr. Hernandez, were both connected to the then missing Chevrolet Suburban, these officers had concern for the safety of Mr. Hernandez. The officers walked to the rear of the house using flashlights to determine if there was any forced entry or if there was sign of any occupant. No signs of forced entry or occupants were observed.

The officers knocked on a neighbor's door and spoke with the occupants. These neighbors indicated that they knew Mr. Hernandez. One of the occupants identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots, Joe Judge. Mr. Judge indicated that he had last seen Mr. Hernandez on Thursday, June 13, 2013, after releasing Mr. Hernandez from practice along with other members of the New England Patriots. Mr. Judge did not have any contact information for Mr. Hernandez and was unable to provide us with any information as to his whereabouts. Mr. Judge told this affiant that Aaron Hernandez is a player for the New England Patriots.

At approximately 10:30 PM these officers were parked on the street in front of Mr. Hernandez's residence when they observed Mr. Hernandez exit the residence and walk down the driveway towards them. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had seen the



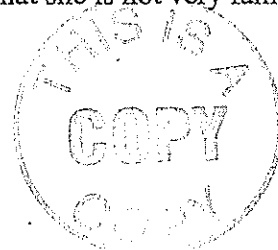
officers in front of the house parked on the street through the video surveillance system. Det. Arrighi and I identified ourselves to Mr. Hernandez and began asking him questions about the black Chevy Suburban he had rented. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle for his friend "O". I asked who "O" was and Mr. Hernandez replied "Odin". I asked Mr. Hernandez how he knew Odin and he stated that his girlfriend's sister was dating Odin. Mr. Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle from the Enterprise rental company on Rt. 1 in North Attleboro, MA. I asked when the last time he saw Odin was and he replied that he last saw Odin "up his way yesterday," indicating that he saw him last on Sunday, June 16, 2013 in Boston. Mr. Hernandez was unable to provide me a location where this was; however, he stated that he had the address saved on his GPS.

Mr. Hernandez described that he observed us outside of his home on his video surveillance system. Mr. Hernandez then became argumentative with both Det. Arrighi and I and asked "what's with all the questions." He then stated that we would need to speak with his attorney. Mr. Hernandez then entered his residence, locking the door behind him, and he retrieved a business card for his attorney. Mr. Hernandez unlocked the door and handed the card to these officers. We informed Mr. Hernandez that this was a death investigation. Mr. Hernandez slammed the door and relocked it behind him. Mr. Hernandez did not ask officers whose death was being investigated. Mr. Hernandez's demeanor did not indicate any concern for the death of any person. Contact was then made with Mr. Hernandez's attorney.

SHAYANNA JENKINS

These officers returned to our vehicle. At approximately 10:40 PM while we remained parked in front of Mr. Hernandez's residence, Mr. Hernandez exited his residence and stated he would follow us to the police station to speak with us. Mr. Hernandez stated that his girlfriend would give him a ride. We followed Mr. Hernandez and his girlfriend to the North Attleboro Police Station which he entered. Mr. Hernandez's girlfriend then drove away from the police station. I followed her out of the lot and flashed my blue lights off and on and the vehicle pulled over adjacent to the North Attleboro Police Department. Det. Arrighi and I then spoke with the driver, identified as Ms. Shayanna Jenkins, DOB: 05-29-1989. I informed Ms. Jenkins about the death of Mr. Lloyd and she immediately began to cry. I asked her if she would speak to us in the parking lot of the Police Station. She agreed to speak there because her child was sleeping in the back seat of the vehicle.

Ms. Jenkins stated that she is the girlfriend of Aaron Hernandez and that they both live together at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. in North Attleboro. Ms. Jenkins stated that Mr. Lloyd dates her sister Shaneah Jenkins. Ms. Jenkins stated that she is not very familiar



with Mr. Lloyd and that she does not know his family or any of his friends. Ms. Jenkins stated that the connection between Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd is through her sister Shaneah. Ms. Jenkins stated that she last saw Mr. Lloyd on Saturday, June 15, 2013 at approximately 10:30 AM. Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd were both at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. in the black Suburban rental vehicle. Ms. Jenkins stated that Mr. Hernandez and Mr. Lloyd discussed returning the rental vehicle to Enterprise Rental.

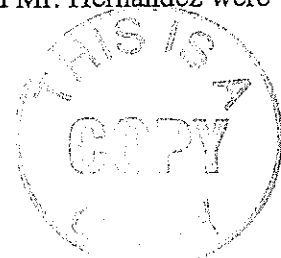
Ms. Jenkins indicated that she was aware that Mr. Lloyd smoked marijuana and that he also was a marijuana dealer. Ms. Jenkins stated that she would often observe Mr. Lloyd on his phone talking about marijuana sales. She stated that his phone was constantly ringing and that he was constantly talking in "lingo" that led her to believe the conversations were about marijuana sales. Ms. Jenkins provided investigators with the cell phone number for Mr. Hernandez as well as her sister Shaneah Jenkins. Ms. Jenkins also stated that Mr. Hernandez's cell phone number is [REDACTED]

Ms. Jenkins stated they had recently installed a video surveillance system within their residence. Ms. Jenkins stated that this video surveillance system would allow for the viewing of both the front of their residence as well as the street. Ms. Jenkins stated that the video surveillance system records and plays the video on their home entertainment system. Ms. Jenkins stated that there had been several recent break-in attempts at their residence located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, Ma.

Ms. Jenkins stated that both she and Mr. Hernandez were home on Sunday, June 16, 2013 during the day. She stated that they had gone out to dinner for Father's Day later in the day and that a babysitter had stayed with their child. Ms. Jenkins stated that later that evening she had gone to bed early. However, she stated that she was aware that Mr. Hernandez was not home all night and that she was unsure of what time he got home or who he had gone out with. At this time during our conversation Mr. Hernandez called her on her cell phone and informed her that his sports agent said that she should not speak with us and that she should request to speak with her attorney.

ODIN LLOYD CELL PHONE

The cellular telephone recovered from the body of Mr. Lloyd was taken by investigators to the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators conducted a search of Mr. Lloyd's cellular phone at the police station. Mr. Hernandez's cell phone number, [REDACTED] appears in "Nigga Dis" and "Dis Nigga" in Mr. Lloyd's cell phone. According to Mr. Lloyd's cellular call logs Mr. Lloyd and Mr. Hernandez were



engaged in conversation by text and voice on June 16 and 17, 2013. On June 16, 2013 at approximately 9:05 PM Mr. Hernandez texted to Mr. Lloyd: "I'm coming to grab that tonight u gon b around I need dat and we could step for a little again [sic]." No immediate response was made by Mr. Lloyd. On June 16, 2013 at approximately 9:34 PM Mr Hernandez texted to Mr. Lloyd: "Waddup." At 9:37 PM, Mr. Lloyd responded: "Aite (meaning alright), where." At 9:39 PM Mr. Hernandez responded: "idk (meaning I don't know) it don't matter but imma hit u when I'm dat way like Las time if my phone dies imma hit u when I charge it which will be in a lil [sic]." At 10 PM Mr. Lloyd responded: "Aite idk anything goin on [sic]" Mr. Hernandez's next and last text to Mr. Lloyd was at 10:13: "I'll figure it out ill hit u on way." At 12:22 AM Mr. Lloyd made his last text to Mr. Hernandez: "We still on."

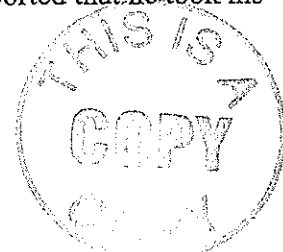
Mr. Lloyd's call records then show further contact, via phone with Mr. Hernandez.

When Mr. Hernandez was at the station on June 17, 2013, he had a cellular telephone in his possession and an investigator dialed the number [REDACTED]. The phone was observed to ring and Mr. Hernandez was seen and heard to answer the phone. The investigator hung up without speaking to Mr. Hernandez.

One of the last messages sent by the victim was sent to his sister, Shaquilla Thibou. Ms. Thibou saw Mr. Lloyd get into a silver-colored sedan and depart 10 Fayston Street, Dorchester between 1 and 2 AM on June 17, 2013. At 3:07 AM, Mr. Lloyd texted Ms. Thibou: "U saw who I'm with" and again at 3:11 AM "hello." At 3:19 AM, the victim's sister replied "my phone was dead who was that?" The victim replied to his sister "Nfl." According to Ms. Thibou, Mr. Lloyd was recently associating with "Hernandez" a New England Patriot football player. She understood this text to mean that Mr. Lloyd was with Aaron "Hernandez." Ms. Thibou replied at 3:22 AM "Lol your aggy." The last text sent by the victim was at 3:23 AM. This text immediately followed the "Nfl" text. Mr. Lloyd described he was giving Ms. Lloyd this information "just so u know."

JOHN MEDEIROS

John Medeiros a resident of East Providence Rhode Island is an employee of Needle Tech in North Attleboro. Mr. Mediros reported to Detective Daniel Arrighi of the North Attleboro Police Department that on the morning of June 17, 2013, he was at his place of employment. This is located at 452 John Dietsch Boulevard, and is approximately 200 yards from the scene. Mr. Medeiros reported that he took his



regularly scheduled break between 3:00 and 3:30 AM. While he was on his break he sat in his vehicle in the parking lot. He reported to Det. Arrighi that he heard (3) gunshots and a car door slamming.

SHAQUILLA THIBOU

Tprs. Chad Laliberte and Zack Johnson interviewed Mr. Lloyd's sister following the death notification. She indicated that she lived with her brother at 10 Fayston St. Apt. #2, Boston, MA. Ms. Thibou indicated that she last saw her brother at or between 1:00 to 2:00 AM in front of 10 Fayston Street. According to Ms. Thibou, Mr. Lloyd got into a silver four door car with three other males whose identities were unknown to her. The vehicle and the occupants left the area. Ms. Thibou told investigators that she had never seen this car before. According to Ms. Thibou, she was aware that Mr. Lloyd was dating a woman named Shaneah. Ms. Thibou stated that Shaneah was the sister of Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend, Shayanna Jenkins, who lives with Hernandez in North Attleboro, MA. Ms. Thibou stated that, other than Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins, she did not know of any other contacts that Mr. Lloyd has in the North Attleboro area.

Ms. Thibou showed investigators some of the text messages that her brother had sent to her. These messages were explained to investigators and are described above in this affidavit. Ms. Thibou explained that her response to her brother stating "lol your aggy." She indicated that this meant that she was aggravated by her brother's text.

SHANEAH JENKINS

Tpr. Benson conducted a phone interview with Shaneah Jenkins, the victim's girlfriend. According to Shaneah Jenkins she did not know Mr. Lloyd to have any connection to North Attleboro other than her sister Shayanna Jenkins and Mr. Hernandez. She stated that Mr. Lloyd was her boyfriend and that they were presently in a long distance dating relationship of approximately one year.



ENTERPRISE RENTAL NORTH ATTLEBORO

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013 at approximately 10:00 AM, investigators arrived at Enterprise Rental Company located at 365 East Washington St., North Attleboro, MA. Investigators spoke with the Enterprise Rental manager who indicated that he was familiar with Aaron Hernandez due to the fact that he frequently rented vehicles from Enterprise Rental. The manager informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez came to Enterprise Rental on Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 5:30 PM. At this time, Mr. Hernandez was accompanied by two additional unknown males. Mr. Hernandez returned a rental vehicle which had been rented in his name. This vehicle was a silver colored 2012 Nissan Altima, MA Registration [REDACTED]. At this time Aaron Hernandez rented another rental vehicle, a grey Chrysler 300C, bearing Rhode Island registration [REDACTED]. According to the manager, Mr. Hernandez apologized for damage done to the driver's side exterior mirror and driver's door of the silver Nissan Altima. Although he apologized for the damage, Mr. Hernandez claimed that he did not know how the damage occurred. He said that he just came out in the morning and saw that it was damaged.

The Nissan Altima was viewed by investigators at the Enterprise Rental lot in North Attleboro. Investigators observed that there was damage to the driver's side front door. The driver's side mirror was mangled at the connection to the door and the mirror and housing were missing. Further, there was damage to the driver's side window and a chrome strip at the window. There were scratches on the driver's side door. There appeared to be soil, similar in color and appearance to that at the location where Mr. Lloyd was found, on the tires and lower panels of the vehicle behind the tires. This soil was also seen within the tire tread(s) and wheel(s) well of the tires of the silver Nissan Altima.

Mass State Police Investigators viewed the tire treads and the tire treads appear to be consistent with the tire marks left at the scene where the body of Mr. Lloyd was recovered.

Enterprise Rental Car consented to provide the Nissan Altima rental to the Massachusetts State Police. The Nissan Altima is currently in the possession of the Massachusetts State Police.



VIDEO SURVEILLANCE - 22 RONALD C. MEYER DR.

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013 investigators applied for and were granted a search warrant for 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA. As a result of this search, digital video evidence was seized and reviewed by investigators from the home surveillance system. This video surveillance system was attached to (14) cameras both inside and outside of the residence.

Investigators reviewed the surveillance video from Monday, June 17, 2013.

Investigators observed that at approximately 12:00 AM on Monday morning, a motor vehicle, which appears to be gray in color Nissan Altima, arrive at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro. The surveillance video shows two male occupants in the vehicle. The two males are then shown in the driveway changing their clothes one of the males appears to take a new top out of the backseat of the Nissan Altima.

The video surveillance recording further shows that on Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 3:30 AM, a vehicle, which appears to be the same gray Nissan Altima, consistent with the Nissan Altima Mr. Hernandez rented from Enterprise Rental Car, pulls into the driveway and parks at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA (Investigators have not yet reviewed the videotape to determine at what time the motor vehicle departed from the address). The vehicle is observed to have a broken driver's side mirror, damage that was not previously seen on the vehicle. Three males are observed entering the residence into the kitchen area towards the front foyer area. One of the males is positively identified by investigators as Aaron Hernandez, the homeowner and the renter of the gray Nissan Altima. The second male is identified as a dark-skinned male, older, large belly, approximately 5'8" – 5'10". This male (male #2) is observed to walk to the basement door and enter into the basement through the basement door. The third male is observed to walk into the residence behind both Aaron Hernandez and the male #2. This male, (male #3) is described as being approximately 5'11" – 6'0 tall wearing a light colored, long sleeved top outerwear. This male was seen stopping in the kitchen. Male #3 turns away from the camera and then pulls up a piece of his dark colored clothing, covering his head and face from the camera. Male #3 is then seen standing next to male #2 before male #2 exits the camera view by walking into the basement. Investigators observed males #2 and #3 and Aaron Hernandez enter the basement out of view of the camera. Aaron Hernandez is observed to be in and out of the basement on several different occasions while also going to other rooms within the residence. After about six minute of being in the residence, Aaron Hernandez is seen entering the basement for the final time. There is no activity seen until the recording stops after 3:40 AM.



During the execution of the search warrant investigators learned that the controls and storage devices for the surveillance system are located within the basement.

Investigators reviewed the video from the outside camera facing the driveway. At approximately 5:00 PM on June 17, 2013, Aaron Hernandez and the two males are observed to enter the grey Nissan Altima and drive away from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Dr. North Attleboro, MA.

SHAQUILLA THIBOU

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013 Shaquilla Thibou was driven to the North Attleboro Police Department by State Police Troopers. Ms. Thibou was re-interviewed regarding the information she had concerning the last time she saw her brother alive. During the course of the recorded interview, Ms. Thibou was able to provide additional details regarding the early morning hours of Monday, June 17, 2013. Ms. Thibou recalled that she was seated in a car speaking with her boyfriend and that her brother was standing outside of their house at 10 Fayston St. Boston. Ms. Thibou recalled that her cell phone battery had died at some point while seated in the car speaking with her boyfriend. Ms. Thibou witnessed a vehicle, which she described as a silver-colored four door sedan, resembling either a Nissan Altima or Maxima or Toyota Camry pull up in front of her residence. Her brother opened the rear passenger door and got inside. It appeared that there were three other males within the vehicle. This vehicle then drove away from 10 Fayston St. Boston.

Ms. Thibou stated that she entered her apartment and plugged her cellphone into a charger. Ms. Thibou then received two text messages from her brother. The time stamp on her cellphone indicated "JUN 17, 2013, 3:07AM". Ms. Thibou used this time stamp as a reference to recall the approximate time that she had seen her brother get into the silver four door sedan. Based on the time stamp Ms. Thibou indicated that she approximated that time frame in which she saw her brother get into the car was closer to 3:00 AM as opposed to the 1:00 – 2:00 AM time frame that she had given as estimation the prior day.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE FROM 9 FAYSTON ST. BOSTON

Investigators learned from Boston Police Detectives that there was a video surveillance system in place at 9 Fayston Street, Boston. This residence is across from



Mr. Lloyd's and Ms. Thibou's apartment at 10 Fayston Street, Boston. Boston Police investigators spoke with the homeowner at 9 Fayston Street, Boston and obtained a copy of the surveillance footage for Monday, June 17, 2013. Massachusetts State Police investigators reviewed the video surveillance footage and observed that at approximately 2:33 AM a vehicle, identified by investigators as a silver-colored Nissan Altima arrives in front of 10 Fayston Street, Boston. The video shows a male, believed to be the victim Odin Lloyd, enter into the rear passenger's side of the vehicle. This information is consistent with information provided to us by Mr. Lloyd's sister, Ms. Thibou. Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the vehicle as it arrived at 10 Fayston Street, Boston. Investigators were able to determine that once the door was opened, the interior light illuminated the interior of the vehicle, providing a better view of the occupants of the vehicle, including the operator of the Nissan Altima who was observed to be wearing a white shirt. Additionally, investigators observe that the Nissan Altima's driver's-side exterior mirror was intact and attached to the vehicle at that time.

CONCLUSION

Based on the preceding, investigators believe that there is probable cause to believe that a crime was committed and that Mr. Lloyd's death was a homicide. I believe a search of the Nissan Altima would lead investigators to evidence relative to the homicide of Odin Lloyd.

I have personal knowledge, based upon experience and training, that crimes of violence often involve a struggle and the use of weapons or other instrumentalities. I also know that the person or persons participating in the commission of a violent offense are in contact with the physical surroundings and often leave evidence or trace evidence that if collected will help to identify the perpetrators and / or the nature of the crime. I am aware that there is often an attempt to alter, destroy, remove, clean up, or cover up evidence of a crime. I am aware that evidence of a crime may be left in the form of gunshot residue, clothing, physiological fluids, palm prints, shoe prints, fibers, fingerprints, footprints, tire tread impressions, hair, saliva, semen, blood, firearms, pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns, ammunition, shell casings, projectiles, hatchets, axes, cutting instruments, knife and / or knives, cellular telephones, pieces of identification in print, photograph, or video that may identify any or all of the parties named in the investigation. I am also aware that many of these items are minute and/or microscopic, and are often referred to as trace and biological evidence and that specialized training and equipment is needed for the collection of such trace and biological evidence.



Based on the above facts and information, I have probable cause to believe that the above described evidence may be found on or in a 2012 Nissan Altima, color grey, VIN: [REDACTED] bearing Ma. registration [REDACTED] which is currently being secured by investigators as a crime scene. This vehicle is owned by EAN Holdings (Enterprise Rental) and was rented by Aaron Hernandez, DOB: 11-06-1989.

I therefore request that the court authorize a search of the above described vehicle, for trace/biological evidence including blood, serums, skin, clothing, gunshot residue, fingerprints, tire tread impression, DNA and any other evidence as described above to assist in the identification of a suspect or suspects, and that if any of the above evidence is found that it be seized as evidence and further analyzed or searched as necessary.


The release of this information would allow unfettered access to it and this would hinder the ability of the investigators to pursue investigative leads in this matter and hinder the ongoing criminal investigation.



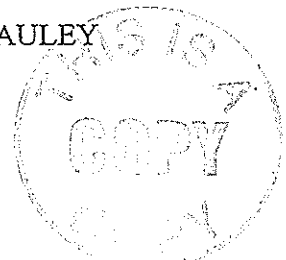
AFFIDAVIT

6. Consequently release of this information would interfere with the Commonwealth's ability to continue to obtain information relevant and material to the investigation; and

Affidavit in Support of Search Warrant

I, Trooper Eric J. Benson #3389, being duly sworn, depose and say:

I am a Massachusetts State Police Trooper and have been so employed since September 22, 2006. I am currently assigned to the Bristol County State Police Detective Unit attached to the Bristol County District Attorney's Office and have been so assigned since November of 2009. My primary responsibilities include the investigation of unattended natural deaths, accidental deaths, suicides, and homicides.

I have personal knowledge of the facts and circumstances related below, as the result of my own investigative efforts and those of other police officers who have reported their findings to me.

I have probable cause to believe that the crime of Murder, a violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 was committed in an unimproved area in the vicinity of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro on or about Monday, June 17, 2013.

I also have probable cause to believe that Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-6-1989) (SS#- [REDACTED]) committed the following crimes on Monday, June 17, 2013: Murder of Odin Lloyd in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 and Possession of Firearm without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(a). Additionally, I also have probable cause to believe that Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-6-1989) committed the following crimes on Saturday, June 22, 2013: Possession of a Large Capacity Rifle without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(m); Possession of Ammunition without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(h); and Possession of a Large Capacity Feeding Device without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(m).

I further have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crimes of Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1, Possession of Firearm without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(a), and Possession of Ammunition without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(h) will be found within the contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots locker. The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant for the contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots locker are as follows:



Initial Response

On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 5:37 p.m., the North Attleboro Police Department responded to a cellular 911 call reporting a dead body in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. The North Attleboro Police Department responded to a secluded area in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro and located a deceased male lying supine on the ground. The initial responding police officers observed several apparent gunshot wounds in the upper torso area of the then unidentified deceased black male. The initial responding officers further observed a small amount of blood in the area of the apparent gunshot wounds. The initial responding officers located five (5) .45 caliber discharged cartridge casings on the ground in the immediate area of the deceased male body. The initial responding officers also located a white towel on the ground in the area where the deceased male was discovered. The initial responding officers did not observe a firearm in the area of the deceased male. The initial responding officers observed a set of automobile tire tracks that appeared to have been recently made in relatively close proximity to the deceased male. The area where the deceased male was found is remotely located and used as a processing area for construction materials such as dirt, gravel, stone, asphalt, and fill. The police did not observe any vehicles at the location where the black male individual was found deceased.

The police conducted a search of the body of the deceased black male during the processing of the crime scene on Monday, June 17, 2013. The police observed that the pants pockets of the deceased male appeared to be undisturbed, leading the police to believe that no post-mortem attempt had been made to remove items from the pants pockets of the victim.

A wallet containing a Massachusetts Drivers License bearing the name Odin L. Lloyd (DOB: 11/14/1985) of 10 Fayston Street, Apt. # 2, in Boston was located inside the right rear pants pocket of the deceased black male. The photograph on Odin Lloyd's Massachusetts Driver's License matched the general physical appearance of the deceased male. Two sets of keys for a black 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] were located in the front right pants pocket of the deceased male individual presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. The keychain attached to the two sets of keys for the 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] indicated that the vehicle was owned by Enterprise Rent-A-Car. An HTC 1 cellular telephone was located in the right front sweatshirt pocket of the deceased male presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. An amount of \$64.75 in loose cash was located in the back left pants pocket of Odin Lloyd.

The police contacted Enterprise Rent-A-Car at T.F. Green Airport in Rhode Island and learned that the vehicle described on the keys in the pocket of Odin Lloyd (2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED]) was currently being rented by Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. A check of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles database showed an Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-6-1989) with an address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

Next of Kin Notification and Preliminary Family Interviews



On the night of Monday, June 17, 2013, police officers traveled to Odin Lloyd's residential address of 10 Fayston Street in Boston in order to attempt to make a death notification to his next of kin. Officers notified Odin Lloyd's next of kin and interviewed some of his friends and family members upon their arrival at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers observed Aaron Hernandez's rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban, the keys to which were found in Odin Lloyd's pocket, backed into the yard behind a chain link fence at 10 Fayston Street in Boston.

Officers interviewed Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou, following the death notification. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she lived with Odin Lloyd at 10 Fayston Street, Apt. #2, in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated that she last saw Odin Lloyd in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston between approximately 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou went on to indicate that she last saw Odin Lloyd when he entered a silver four door car with three other males whose identities she did not know in the area of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that the silver vehicle left the area after Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle. Shaquilla Thibou told investigators that she had never seen this silver car before Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated Odin Lloyd was dating a woman named Shaneah. Shaquilla Thibou explained that Shaneah was the sister of Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend, Shayanna Jenkins. Shaquilla Thibou stated that, other than Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins, she did not know of any other individuals who Odin Lloyd knew in the North Attleboro area.

Shaquilla Thibou showed investigators some of the text messages that Odin Lloyd had sent to her after he entered the silver vehicle on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou explained these text messages to investigators and are described below in this affidavit.

Initial contact with Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins

Officers traveled to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro and attempted to make contact with the occupants of the residence on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers were initially unable to make contact with any of the residents of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. While attempting to make contact with the residents, officers observed three (3) large surveillance cameras permanently affixed to the exterior of the residence. Officers also observed that the television and numerous lights were on inside the residence. Despite repeated efforts to summons the occupants, no one came to the door of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Based on the totality of the circumstances that brought the police to the residence and the inability of the police to make contact with the residents, the officers went to the rear of the 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro to determine if there was any forced entry or sign of the occupants. The officers did not observe any signs of forced entry or the residents of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

The officers then proceeded to a neighboring residence and spoke with a neighbor who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots. The individual who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots indicated that he had last seen Aaron Hernandez, a player for the New England Patriots, at football practice on Thursday, June 13, 2013. The individual who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots did not

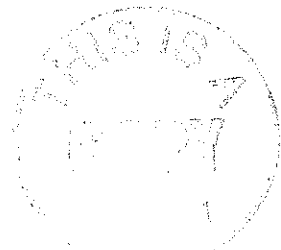


have any contact information for Aaron Hernandez and was unable to provide any information as to the whereabouts of Aaron Hernandez.

These same officers returned to their vehicle and were parked on the street in front of Aaron Hernandez's residence when they observed Aaron Hernandez exit his residence and walk down the driveway in their direction at approximately 10:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez told the officers that he had seen them parked in front of the house through his video surveillance system. The officers identified themselves and asked Aaron Hernandez questions about the Chevrolet Suburban he had rented. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle for his friend "O." When asked who "O" was, Aaron Hernandez replied "Odin." When asked how he knew Odin, Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend's sister was dating Odin. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle from Enterprise Rent-A-Car on Route 1 in North Attleboro. When asked when he last saw Odin, Aaron Hernandez replied that he last saw Odin "up his way yesterday," indicating that he last saw Odin in Boston on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Although Aaron Hernandez was unable to provide the officers with the location where he last saw Odin, he stated that he (Aaron Hernandez) saved the address in his GPS. Aaron Hernandez then became argumentative with the officers, and asked: "what's with all the questions?" Aaron Hernandez then stated that the police would need to speak with his attorney. Aaron Hernandez entered his residence, locking the door behind him, and retrieved a business card for his attorney. Aaron Hernandez then unlocked the door and handed his attorney's business card to the officers. When the officers told Aaron Hernandez that they were conducting a death investigation, Aaron Hernandez slammed the door and locked it behind him. Aaron Hernandez did not ask the officers whose death was being investigated nor did he display any outward signs of concern. Contact was then made with Aaron Hernandez's attorney.

The officers returned to their vehicle once again. Shortly after the officers returned to their vehicle, Aaron Hernandez exited his residence and stated that he would follow the officers to the police station to speak with the police. Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) would give him a ride to the police station. The officers followed Aaron Hernandez and his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) to the North Attleboro Police Department. Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) drove away after dropping Aaron Hernandez off at the North Attleboro Police Department. Aaron Hernandez entered the police station and was escorted to the Detective Division. Aaron Hernandez awaited the arrival of his attorneys in an interview room within the Detective Division of the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators observed Aaron Hernandez lying on the floor of the interview room while awaiting the arrival of his attorney. Aaron Hernandez was also observed using his cellular telephone while inside the interview room at the North Attleboro Police Department.

Investigators followed Shayanna Jenkins out of the parking lot and stopped Shayanna Jenkins' vehicle a short distance away from the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators then spoke with Shayanna Jenkins (DOB: 05/29/1989). Investigators informed Shayanna Jenkins about the death of Odin Lloyd. Shayanna Jenkins immediately began to cry upon learning that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shayanna Jenkins agreed to speak to the investigators where her vehicle had been stopped because her child was sleeping in the back seat of the vehicle.



Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and her boyfriend, Aaron Hernandez, live together at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd was in a dating relationship with her sister, Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was not very familiar with Odin Lloyd and claimed not to know Odin Lloyd's family or any of Odin Lloyd's friends. Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd knew each other through Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she last saw Odin Lloyd at approximately 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez were both inside the black Chevrolet Suburban at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd discussed returning the rental vehicle to Enterprise Rent-A-Car.

Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Odin Lloyd smoked marijuana and was also a marijuana dealer. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she would often observe Odin Lloyd on his telephone talking about marijuana sales. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Odin Lloyd's telephone was constantly ringing and that he was frequently talking in "lingo," leading her to believe the conversations were about marijuana sales. Investigators have spoken with more than two dozen individuals who knew Odin Lloyd and have not located any other witness who described Odin Lloyd as a large scale drug dealer.

Shayanna Jenkins provided investigators with the cellular telephone numbers for Aaron Hernandez and her sister, Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number was [REDACTED]. Aaron Hernandez had a cellular telephone in his possession while he was at the North Attleboro Police Department on Monday, June 17, 2013. An investigator called the telephone number [REDACTED] while Aaron Hernandez was at the North Attleboro Police Department on Monday, June 17, 2013. The cellular telephone that Aaron Hernandez had in his possession was observed to ring when the investigator called telephone number [REDACTED] on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez answered his cellular telephone, but the investigator hung up without speaking to Aaron Hernandez.

Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and Aaron Hernandez had recently installed a video surveillance system within their residence. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that this video surveillance system would allow for the viewing of both the front of their residence as well as the street. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that the video surveillance system recorded and played the video on their home entertainment system. Shayanna Jenkins stated that there had been several recent break-in attempts at their residence.

Shayanna Jenkins further stated that both she and Aaron Hernandez were home during the day on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and Aaron Hernandez had gone out to dinner for Father's Day and a babysitter had stayed with their infant child. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that she had gone to bed early but Aaron Hernandez had gone out on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was unsure who Aaron Hernandez had gone out with or what time Aaron Hernandez came home on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013 into Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez called Shayanna Jenkins on her cellular telephone while she was speaking with the police and informed her that his sports agent said that she should not speak with the police and that she should request to speak with her



attorney. Shayanna Jenkins then departed from the area of the North Attleboro Police Department.

Aaron Hernandez's attorneys arrived at the North Attleboro Police Department at approximately 12:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 18, 2013. An Assistant District Attorney, a Massachusetts State Police Lieutenant, and a North Attleboro Police Detective Sergeant met with the attorneys in a conference room. Aaron Hernandez signed a consent to search form authorizing the warrantless search of his rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] that was located at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Aaron Hernandez's attorneys agreed that the cellular telephone in the possession of Aaron Hernandez would be maintained without alteration until either Aaron Hernandez consented to provide his cellular telephone to the police or a search warrant was issued for the cellular telephone. Aaron Hernandez left the North Attleboro Police Department in the company of his attorneys on the morning of Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

Cellular Telephone Communication

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone was searched by investigators for information related to the death of Odin Lloyd. Investigators learned that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number appeared as a contact in Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone contacts. The analysis of Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone revealed that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez engaged in extensive text and voice cellular telephone communication on Sunday, June 16, 2013 and Monday, June 17, 2013. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:05 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "I'm coming to grab that tonight u gon b around I need dat and we could step for a little again [sic]." Odin Lloyd did not immediately respond to Aaron Hernandez's text message. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:34 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "Waddup." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:37 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite (meaning alright), where." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:39 p.m., Aaron Hernandez responded: "idk (meaning I don't know) it don't matter but imma hit u when I'm dat way like Las time if my phone dies imma hit u when I charge it which will be in a lil [sic]." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:00 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite idk anything goin on [sic]" Aaron Hernandez's last text message to Odin Lloyd was at 10:13 p.m. on Sunday, June 16, 2013 and read: "I'll figure it out ill hit u on way." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 12:22 a.m., Odin Lloyd sent his last text message to Aaron Hernandez: "We still on." Odin Lloyd's call records show no further cellular telephone communication with Aaron Hernandez.

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone call logs showed that Odin Lloyd received five (5) telephone calls from telephone number [REDACTED] between 1:22 a.m. and 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The last answered incoming telephone call on Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone was from telephone number [REDACTED] at 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators called telephone number [REDACTED] several times on Tuesday, June 18, 2013 in an attempt to contact the last person who spoke to Odin Lloyd by telephone. The telephone associated with telephone number [REDACTED] was not answered on Tuesday, June 18, 2013.



On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, a search warrant was obtained for Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone. On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, investigators conducted a search of Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone and determined that telephone number [REDACTED] was listed in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone contact list. Investigators determined that telephone number [REDACTED] is listed as "Fish 2" in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone. Investigators were able to determine that the contact "Fish 2" in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone is Ernest G. Wallace Jr.

Text messages were located between Aaron Hernandez and two of his (Aaron Hernandez's) associates on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:02 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to telephone number [REDACTED] (Ernest G. Wallace Jr.): "Please make it back cuZ I'm Def trying to step for a little [sic]" On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:35 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Ernest Wallace: "Get ur ass up here [sic]..." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:23 p.m. Aaron Hernandez sent another text message to Ernest Wallace: "Hurry ur ass up nigga [sic]" On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:21 p.m., Aaron Hernandez received a text message from his other male associate who advised: "On r way a...God bless [sic]" Aaron Hernandez then sent a text message to his other male associate: "Bet hurry up tell fish to drive nigga [sic]."

Interviews of Employees from Business in the Vicinity of the Crime Scene

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, and Tuesday, June 25, 2013, investigators interviewed employees from a business that is located within a few hundred yards of the crime scene. These employees described that they were on break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Three employees of this business reported hearing multiple gunshots coming from the area where Odin Lloyd's body was located during their break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Shaneah Jenkins

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 1:05 a.m., the police interviewed Shaneah Jenkins by telephone. Shaneah Jenkins explained that she was Odin Lloyd's girlfriend of over one (1) year. Shaneah Jenkins became very emotional when she was informed that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins claimed that she had not previously known that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins stated that she did not know Odin Lloyd to have any connection to North Attleboro other than her sister, Shayanna Jenkins, and Aaron Hernandez.

Investigators have had further contact with Shaneah Jenkins and learned that Odin Lloyd spent time with Aaron Hernandez on Friday, June 14, 2013 and Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that she was contacted by her sister, Shayanna Jenkins, on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins further indicated that Shayanna Jenkins explained that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez were together in Boston on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013 into Saturday, June 15, 2013 and that Aaron Hernandez had not returned home. Shaneah Jenkins went on to indicate that Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez was not

responding to her attempts to contact him (Aaron Hernandez) on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that she contacted Odin Lloyd on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins further indicated that Odin Lloyd explained that he had gone out with Aaron Hernandez on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013 into Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins went on to indicate that Odin Lloyd stated that he and Aaron Hernandez got drunk and slept outside of the house. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that Aaron Hernandez allowed Odin Lloyd to use his rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban on the morning of Saturday, June 17, 2013.

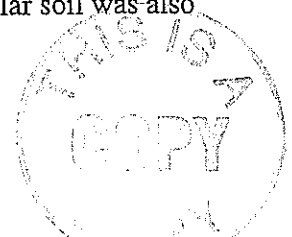
Rumor Nightclub

Investigators have interviewed witnesses working in and around Rumor Nightclub in Boston. Aaron Hernandez is observed entering the nightclub with Odin Lloyd on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013. Additionally, a witness who works in the area of Rumor Nightclub reported to investigators that he observed Aaron Hernandez with what appeared to be a handgun in his waistband on Friday, June 14, 2013.

Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 10:00 a.m., investigators traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car located at 365 East Washington Street in North Attleboro. Investigators spoke with the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who indicated that he was familiar with Aaron Hernandez due to the fact that he (Aaron Hernandez) frequently rented vehicles from Enterprise Rent-A-Car. The manager informed the police that Aaron Hernandez came to Enterprise Rent-A-Car with two unknown male individuals at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager indicated that Aaron Hernandez returned a silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that he had previously rented in his name. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez rented a grey Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] upon returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that Aaron Hernandez apologized for damage to the driver's side exterior side view mirror and driver's door of the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED]. The manager indicated that although Aaron Hernandez apologized for the damage, he claimed not to know how the damage occurred. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez explained that he just came outside and saw that the vehicle was damaged.

The silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] was viewed by the police at the Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. Investigators observed that there was damage to the front driver's side door. Investigators also observed that the side view mirror on the driver's side was mangled at the connection to the door and the mirror and housing were missing. Investigators further observed damage to the driver's side window and a chrome strip at the driver's side window. There were also scratches on the driver's side door. Investigators observed soil, similar in color and appearance to that at the location where Odin Lloyd's body was found, on the tires and lower panels of the vehicle behind the tires. Similar soil was also



seen within the tire tread(s) and wheel(s) well(s) of the silver Nissan Altima. Investigators also viewed the tire treads and the tire treads appear to be consistent with the tire marks left at the scene where the body of Odin Lloyd was found.

Enterprise Rent-A-Car consented to release the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] to the Massachusetts State Police. Investigators obtained a search warrant for the processing of this vehicle.

Search and Forensic Processing of the Nissan Altima

The 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] was analyzed by the Massachusetts State Police at the State Police Crime Laboratory in Lakeville. The 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] was processed for latent fingerprints by the Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located several fingerprints inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED]. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that were individualized to Odin Lloyd. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that were individualized to an individual with several aliases to Ernest G. Wallace (DOB: 01/28/1972). The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section also located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that were individualized to another male individual who investigators have determined is associated with Aaron Hernandez.

Shaquilla Thibou

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 4:14 p.m., Shaquilla Thibou was interviewed at the North Attleboro Police Department. Shaquilla Thibou was re-interviewed regarding the information she had concerning the last time she saw her brother alive. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she was speaking with her boyfriend in a car that was parked in the vicinity of her residence located at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that her cellular telephone battery had died at some point while she was seated in the car speaking with her boyfriend. Shaquilla Thibou went on to say that she witnessed a silver four door sedan that she believed to be either a Nissan Altima, a Nissan Maxima, or a Toyota Camry pull up in front of her residence on Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that Odin Lloyd entered the silver vehicle through the rear passenger door and the vehicle drove away from the area of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she believed that there were three other individuals in addition to Odin Lloyd inside the silver vehicle.

Shaquilla Thibou stated that she entered her apartment and plugged her cellular telephone into a charger on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she



received two text messages from Odin Lloyd after she plugged her cellular telephone into the charger. The time stamp on her cellular phone indicated "JUN 17, 2013, 3:07AM" Shaquilla Thibou used this time stamp as a reference to recall the approximate time that she had seen her brother get into the silver four door sedan. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she believed that the time that she last saw Odin Lloyd was approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 rather than the initial timeframe of between 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 that she initially provided to the police.

Video Surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro Showing Activities at the Residence Prior to Leaving to Meet with Odin Lloyd

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, investigators executed a search warrant for 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. As a result of this search, digital video evidence was seized and reviewed by investigators from the home surveillance system. The video surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro has been forensically preserved by the Massachusetts State Police Digital Evidence and Multimedia Section (DEMS) and investigators have had the opportunity to review many of the high definition images captured by the surveillance equipment at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

The surveillance video seized from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez arriving in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez is the operator of a white Audi SUV when he arrives in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video further shows that Aaron Hernandez meets two males in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators have been able to determine through the surveillance images that Ernest Wallace was one of the two males who Aaron Hernandez meets in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video reveals that Aaron Hernandez, Shayanna Jenkins, Ernest Wallace, and a third male individual enter the residence at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Interior surveillance footage shows Aaron Hernandez pass through the living room area of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro while holding an item, identified by investigators as being consistent with a firearm. Aaron Hernandez is observed on the surveillance video moving the item believed to be a firearm between his hands as he passes through the living room.

The surveillance video from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows three male individuals exit the residence in the area of the garage at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The first two male individuals exit the residence together, while the third male individual exits the residence several seconds after the first two. The first male individual depicted on surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 is identified as Aaron Hernandez. Aaron Hernandez is wearing a very light colored or white hooded sweatshirt, dark colored pants, and light colored footwear. The second male individual depicted on the surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has dark complexion and is wearing a short sleeve light



colored shirt, dark colored pants, and dark colored shoes. The third male individual depicted on the surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has the darkest complexion of the three male individuals and is wearing a blue and white long sleeve shirt and dark colored pants. Investigators have identified this male as Ernest Wallace. Ernest Wallace appears to carry a light colored plastic bag in his right hand. All three male individuals walk down the driveway towards the street and exit the view of the surveillance video. A short time later, a silver four door vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima reverses up the driveway and parks near the garage. Aaron Hernandez exits the driver's seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima and approaches the garage. Ernest Wallace exits the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle and walks to the rear of the vehicle while apparently manipulating an object in his hands. Ernest Wallace walks around the vehicle and opens the trunk through the open driver's side door after finding the trunk to be locked. Ernest Wallace then opens the trunk of the silver vehicle and appears to manipulate objects inside the trunk for several seconds. Ernest Wallace appears to hand Aaron Hernandez an item that he retrieved from the trunk of the silver vehicle. Aaron Hernandez enters the silver four door vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima with the item that Ernest Wallace retrieved from the trunk of the vehicle. All three male individuals exited the silver vehicle and entered the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The three male individuals then exit the garage and enter the silver vehicle at approximately 1:12 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Ernest Wallace enters the driver's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Aaron Hernandez enters the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The third male individual wearing a short sleeve light colored shirt, dark colored pants, and dark colored shoes enters the silver vehicle through the rear driver's side door. The silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima then drives down the driveway and disappears from the view of the surveillance system. The surveillance video shows that the side view mirror on the driver's side of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima was still in place when the vehicle exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 1:12 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Surveillance Video from Blue Hill Express Service Station

On the evening of Sunday, June 23, 2013, investigators received information that a vehicle that Aaron Hernandez was driving may have refueled at the Blue Hill Express service station on Route 138 in the vicinity of Route 93 in Canton during the early morning hours of June 17, 2013. Investigators visited the service station and met with the station attendant. This station attendant was also working the overnight shift on June 17, 2013. The attendant informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez visited the station, refueled his vehicle, and purchased some items from the convenience store which is attached to the service station at approximately 2:00 a.m. on June 17, 2013. The attendant informed investigators that the service station had numerous surveillance cameras and that video may be available.

The service station attendant provided investigators with the sales receipt for the fuel and the items that Aaron Hernandez purchased on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators viewed the fuel receipt and observed that 18.39 gallons of fuel was purchased at 2:09 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 using a Visa credit card belonging to Aaron Hernandez. The convenience store receipt



revealed that a “BLACK & MILD CIGAR” and “Bubble Yum Cotton” bubble gum were purchased.

Investigators made arrangements with the owner of the Blue Hill Express service station to obtain surveillance video from the early morning hours of Monday, June 17, 2013. This video was obtained and viewed by investigators. The surveillance video shows a silver sedan entering the service station just after 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The operator of the silver sedan is identified as Aaron Hernandez. Aaron Hernandez refuels his vehicle and then enters the convenience store. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez is wearing a light colored or white hooded sweatshirt, dark pants, and light colored shoes while at the Blue Hills Express service station at approximately 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. On Monday, June 24, 2013, at 1:12 a.m., investigators departed the area of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro driving a 2012 Nissan Altima. Investigators determined that the driving time from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro directly to the Blue Hill Express service station was approximately twenty-five (25 minutes) at that time of the morning. Consequently, the evidence shows that Aaron Hernandez did not drive directly to Blue Hill Express. The evidence also shows that prior to arriving at Blue Hill Express Aaron Hernandez left the front passenger seat and became the operator of the vehicle.

The surveillance video at Blue Hill Express service station shows Aaron Hernandez purchasing a cigar and a package of what appears to be bubble gum. The surveillance video at Blue Hill Express service station then shows Aaron Hernandez entering the driver’s seat and the third male individual entering the rear passenger’s seat of the silver vehicle. The silver vehicle then exits the Blue Hill Express service station traveling in the direction of Route 93.

The time that the silver sedan departed from the Blue Hill Express service station, and the geographic location of the Blue Hill Express service station coincide with the timeline and route of travel that investigators believe Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace and the third male individual take to arrive at 10 Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. On Monday, June 24, 2013, investigators drove from the Blue Hill Express service station to 10 Fayston Street in Boston via Route 95/128 and Route 93. Investigators determined that the travel time is approximately 19 minutes.

Video Surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro Showing Activities at the Residence after the Murder of Odin Lloyd

The video surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows that the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima returns to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the same third male individual are observed exiting the silver vehicle in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez is shown exiting the driver’s seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Ernest Wallace is shown exiting the front passenger seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The third male individual is shown on surveillance exiting the rear driver’s seat of the silver vehicle that is



consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual entered the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The interior video surveillance at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez enter and exit the basement on several different occasions while also going into other rooms within the residence. Aaron Hernandez is shown on surveillance video to be in and out of the basement on several different occasions while also going to other rooms within the residence. On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 3:33 a.m., Aaron Hernandez is observed to be standing at the entrance to the basement with what appears to be a gun in his hand. Aaron Hernandez is observed to move the gun between his hands. After about six minutes of being in the residence, Aaron Hernandez enters the basement for the final time after being inside his residence for approximately six minutes. There is no activity seen until the recording stops after 3:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The exterior video surveillance at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual exit the garage and approach the rented 2012 Nissan Altima parked in the driveway at approximately 4:52 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video surveillance further shows that Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual enter the 2012 Nissan Altima and drive away from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 4:54 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video surveillance shows that a gray vehicle consistent with a gray Chrysler 300C entered the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:12 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez exited the driver's seat of the gray vehicle that is consistent with a Chrysler 300C upon arriving in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:12 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Ernest Wallace enters the driver's seat of the gray vehicle that is consistent with a Chrysler 300C. The surveillance video further shows that Ernest Wallace and the same third male individual drive away from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Video Surveillance System at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro

On Thursday, June 20, 2013, investigators spoke with Michael Connors of Home-Tech Custom Design. Michael Connors installed the video surveillance system at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at the direction of Shayanna Jenkins. Among other things, Michael Connors told investigators that the surveillance system records the video of all cameras continuously unless a cable connecting a camera to the system is disconnected. Michael Connors stated that disconnecting a particular camera cable takes that camera off line while the system continues to record footage from the other connected cameras. Michael Connors further stated that he showed Aaron Hernandez how to disconnect specific cameras from the recording device in May of 2013. Michael Connors went on to say that he clearly labeled the connections so that Aaron Hernandez could more easily disconnect cameras at locations within his home where and when he wanted to avoid surveillance recordings.



The Massachusetts State Police Digital Evidence and Multimedia Section determined that the time displayed on the surveillance video recovered from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro differed from the accurate, world time, by 2 minutes and 46 seconds. Where times are described in this affidavit they have been adjusted to actual time. Investigators have followed the same procedure to determine the variance of all video surveillance times from accurate, world time. All video surveillance times in this affidavit are described in world time.

Video Surveillance from Fayston Street in Boston

Investigators learned from Boston Police Detectives that there was a video surveillance system at a residence on Fayston Street in Boston. This residence is located across the street from Odin Lloyd's and Shaquilla Thibou's apartment at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Boston Police investigators spoke with the homeowner and obtained a copy of the surveillance footage for Monday, June 17, 2013. Massachusetts State Police investigators reviewed the video surveillance footage and observed that a vehicle that is consistent with a silver colored Nissan Altima arrived in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:33 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video shows a male individual, believed to be the victim Odin Lloyd, enter into the rear passenger's side of the vehicle. [This information is consistent with information provided to the police by Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou.] Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the vehicle as it arrived at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the silver vehicle when it arrived at 10 Fayston Street in Boston because the interior light illuminated the interior of the vehicle when the rear passenger's side door was opened. Investigators were also able to determine through the surveillance video that the operator of the apparent silver Nissan Altima was wearing a white or very light colored shirt. Additionally, investigators observed that the exterior side view mirror on the driver's side of the apparent silver Nissan Altima was intact and attached to the vehicle at that time.

Surveillance Video from John L. Dietsch Boulevard and Landry Avenue in North Attleboro

Investigators conducted a canvass in the area of the crime scene located in the vicinity of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. Investigators learned that there were several surveillance cameras facing the area of John Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. Investigators viewed several surveillance cameras and observed the following:

A vehicle entered John L. Dietsch Boulevard at approximately 3:20 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The vehicle traveled northbound on John L. Dietsch Boulevard toward 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard and the location where the body of Odin Lloyd was discovered. The arrival of the vehicle at this time and location is consistent with the time that investigators arrived on John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro when they drove a 2012 Nissan Altima from 10 Fayston Street in Boston to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro on Tuesday, June 25, 2013.



An inspection of the video surveillance from a business near the crime scene shows a vehicle traveling north on John L. Dietsch Boulevard towards the rear of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. This vehicle enters the secluded gravel construction area where the body of Odin Lloyd was discovered. This vehicle entered into the crime scene at approximately 3:23 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 and exits the crime scene at approximately 3:27 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The time of this activity is consistent with the reports of employees at an adjacent business who heard gunshots between 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Surveillance video shows a vehicle leaving the crime scene and turning left out onto John L. Dietsch Boulevard in the direction of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Investigators are aware that the direction of travel is consistent with the vehicle coming from the area of Interstate 95.

Investigators inspected additional surveillance video that showed a vehicle traveling north from the direction of the crime scene toward Landry Avenue in North Attleboro. The vehicle passes this location at approximately 3:28 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Investigators located additional surveillance video showing a vehicle turning left onto Landry Avenue from John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. This vehicle is captured on surveillance video heading west on Landry Avenue in the direction of Westwood Estates and 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. This vehicle is shown at this location less than one minute before the vehicle arrives at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

Search of the Dumpster on the Property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013, the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who had previously been interviewed by police contacted investigators with additional information. The manager indicated that she declined an offer from Aaron Hernandez's of blue bubblegum on the evening of Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager further indicated that she secured the keys to the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] in a safe inside Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013 into Tuesday, June 18, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that she cleaned the silver 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented at approximately 7:45 a.m. on Tuesday, June 18, 2013. The manager indicated that while cleaning the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented, she located four items that she disposed of in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager further indicated that she located a small vitamin water bottle in the front driver's side cup holder of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager went on to indicate that she located what appeared to be a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing in the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager indicated that she found a piece of chewed blue bubble gum and a "bullet" underneath the child's drawing underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager further indicated that she used a piece of paper to pick up the piece of chewed blue bubble gum and the "bullet" from the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager also recalled that Aaron Hernandez produced Bubblicious Bubble Gum in a blue Bubblicious Bubble Gum wrapper and offered her a piece of gum while he was returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima



bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Officers immediately traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and secured the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers searched the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers located a bottle of Vitamin Water, a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, a piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and a spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers showed the manager photographs of the bottle of Vitamin Water, the piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, the piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and the spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing that were located inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager identified the items in the photographs as being the items that she removed from the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented and threw in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the morning of Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

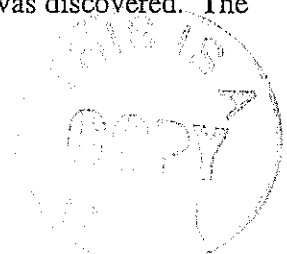
Autopsy

On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, Doctor William Zane of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner conducted the autopsy of Odin Lloyd. Doctor Zane determined that the cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds to the torso area of Odin Lloyd. Doctor William Zane determined that Odin Lloyd was shot in the back and a projectile was recovered in the area of the buttocks. There was a gunshot wound to the right abdomen and a projectile was recovered. There was a gunshot entrance wound to right forearm and there was an exit wound associated with this entrance wound. Two projectiles, consistent with .45 caliber class ammunition were recovered from the body of Odin Lloyd.

Doctor William Zane determined that Odin Lloyd suffered two penetrating wounds which entered Odin Lloyd in the vicinity of each nipple. These wounds completely penetrated the body and no projectiles associated with them were recovered from the body. The paths of both of these wounds were front to back. One projectile penetrated Odin Lloyd's chest, heart lung, liver, and back. The other projectile penetrated Odin Lloyd's chest, lung, ribs and back. Investigators have subsequently been able to recover two projectiles from directly beneath Odin Lloyd's final resting place. This evidence indicates that Odin Lloyd was shot two times in the chest after he was already lying supine on the ground. Doctor William Zane determined that the manner of Odin Lloyd's death was a homicide.

Ballistics

The State Police Firearms Identification Section analyzed the five (5) spent cartridge casings that were recovered from the area near where Odin Lloyd's body was discovered. The



State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the five spent cartridge casings were all .45 caliber and were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

The .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro was sent to the State Police Firearms Identification Section for ballistic analysis. The State Police Firearms Identification Section compared the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro with the five spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body. The State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and the five (5) .45 caliber spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

Several searches have been performed utilizing the State Police SERT Team, metal detectors, and police K-9's that are trained in the detection of firearms and ammunition in the area of the crime scene and in the area between the crime scene and 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro, but a .45 caliber firearm has not been recovered during the course of the investigation.

Second Search of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro

On Saturday, June 22, 2013, the Massachusetts State Police and the North Attleboro Police Department executed a search warrant at the residence of Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11/06/1989) located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive, North Attleboro, MA 02760 in regard to an ongoing criminal investigation.

During the course of the search warrant execution, investigators located a 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle with attached magazine inside a closed black gym bag that was on the back seat of a Toyota sedan that was parked inside the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The rifle was collected as evidence by the State Police Firearms Identification Section.

The rifle was examined by a firearms examiner assigned to the Massachusetts State Police Firearms Identification Section. The State Police firearms examiner determined that the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle was functional and semi-automatic. The State Police firearms examiner test fired the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle and some of the ammunition contained within the magazine that was attached to the rifle when it was located by investigators. The State Police firearms examiner formed the opinion that the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle is a rifle within the meaning of and as defined in Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 140, section 121. The State Police firearms examiner also formed the opinion that the ammunition recovered from within the magazine that was attached to the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle is ammunition within the meaning of and as defined in Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 140, section 121. The State Police firearms examiner also determined that the magazine that was attached to the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle



was a Master Molder magazine with a thirty-three (33) round capacity. The Master Molder magazine contained thirty-three (33) live cartridges of 7.62x39mm caliber ammunition when it was located by investigators.

Investigators also located a box of .22 caliber "Game Loads" ammunition inside a Sentry Safe in the basement of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro during the search warrant execution on Saturday, June 22, 2013.

A query of the Massachusetts Department of Criminal Justice Information Services database revealed that Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11/6/1989) did not have a valid or expired Massachusetts License to Carry Firearms or a Massachusetts Firearms Identification Card on Saturday, June 22, 2013. An additional search of the Massachusetts Department of Criminal Justice Information Services database revealed that 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro is not listed as an address on any Massachusetts License to Carry Firearms or Massachusetts Firearms Identification Cards.

Search of 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. A12, in Franklin

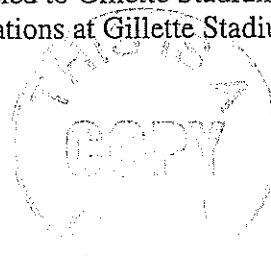
On Wednesday, June 26, 2013, investigators executed several search warrants at an apartment rented by Aaron Hernandez that is located at 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin. Investigators recovered the following items inside 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin: Two boxes of .45 caliber Seminole Arms ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Hornady ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Torbon ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Remington ammunition; One box of .22LR caliber Remington; Four boxes of 7.62 x 39mm Wolf ammunition; One box of 7.62 x 39mm Tulammo ammunition; and one loose live cartridge of 7.62 x 39mm Wolf ammunition.

Search of 2005 Hummer H2

On Wednesday, June 26, 2013, investigators executed a search warrant on a 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]) that was parked in the parking lot of 599 Old West Central Street in Franklin. The keys to the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]) were located inside 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin. Investigators located a loaded .45 caliber Glock magazine inside the center console of the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]). Investigators also located two receipts and an envelope bearing the name Aaron Hernandez inside the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]).

Seizure of the Contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker

On the evening of Thursday, June 27, 2013, investigators traveled to Gillette Stadium in Foxboro where they met with Chief Operating Officer for Team Operations at Gillette Stadium



Mark Briggs. Investigators took custody of a locked container with yellow fabric sides and a wooden top / cover that was secured with a padlock from Mark Briggs. Mark Briggs also provided the key to the padlock on the container to investigators. Mark Briggs advised investigators that the locked container with yellow fabric sides and a wooden top / cover contained all the contents of Aaron Hernandez's locker in the New England Patriots Locker Room at Gillette Stadium. Mark Briggs informed investigators that the contents of Aaron Hernandez's locker in the New England Patriots Locker Room were removed and secured within the locked container with yellow fabric sides and a wooden top / cover at the direction of New England Patriots Management upon Aaron Hernandez being released from his employment with the New England Patriots. Investigators transported the locked container with yellow fabric sides and a wooden top / cover and the key to the padlock on the container to the North Attleboro Police Department where it was placed within a locked evidence safe.

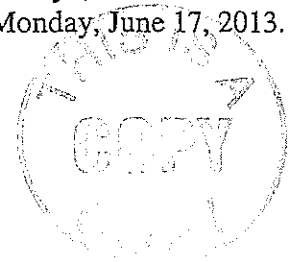
Aaron Hernandez's Access to his New England Patriots Locker after the Murder of Odin Lloyd

On Friday, June 28, 2013, investigators confirmed with Chief Operating Officer for Team Operations at Gillette Stadium Mark Briggs that Aaron Hernandez had visited Gillette Stadium and would have had access to his New England Patriots Locker after the murder of Odin Lloyd. Mark Briggs informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez visited Gillette Stadium on Tuesday, June 18, 2013. Mark Briggs further informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez did not use his swipe card / key fob access at Gillette Stadium because the door to Gillette Stadium was open. Mark Briggs indicated that Aaron Hernandez would have had access to all Football Operations areas within Gillette Stadium. Mark Briggs further indicated that the New England Patriots Locker Room is within the Football Operations area within Gillette Stadium.

Conclusion

Based on the aforementioned information provided in this affidavit, I have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crimes of Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1, Possession of Firearm without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(a), and Possession of Ammunition without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(h) will be found within the contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker. The contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker are currently secured in a locked container with yellow fabric sides and a wooden top / cover that is secured with a padlock.

I therefore request that the court issued a search warrant authorizing the search of the contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker that are currently secured within a locked container with yellow fabric sides and a wooden top / cover for the following items: firearms, firearms feeding devices, ammunition, and other evidence of the crimes described above, including but not limited to receipts and documentation relative to the purchase or transfer of firearms, the relationship between Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd, and the location of Aaron Hernandez and / or Odin Lloyd on Sunday, June 16, 2013 and Monday, June 17, 2013.

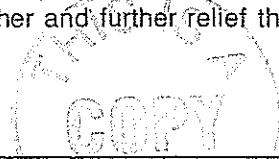

Now comes the Commonwealth in regard to the above-captioned matter and respectfully requests that this Honorable Court order that the search warrant application, the search warrant, the affidavit in support of the search warrant, the search warrant return and the Commonwealth's motion and affidavit to seal and impound be sealed and impounded until further order of the court. The Commonwealth states that these search warrants concern an active and ongoing homicide investigation. The enumerated documents contain details of the facts of the incident, actions of the police, statements of individuals, etc. known to the investigators in this matter.


The release of this information would allow unfettered access to it and this would hinder the ability of the investigators to pursue investigative leads in this matter and hinder the ongoing criminal investigation.

~~For this reason, the Commonwealth respectfully requests that this Honorable Court seal~~
and impound enumerated documents and preclude any and all access to them, or information dissemination about them until further notice of the Court. See New England Internet Café, LLC v. Clerk of the Superior Court for Criminal Business in Suffolk County, 462 Mass. 76, 83 (2012)(Publicity of judicial records is not absolute and may be restricted on a showing of "good cause."

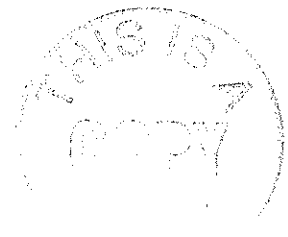

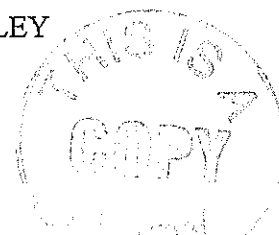
AFFIDAVIT

1. I am an Assistant District Attorney;

5. 6. Consequently release of this information would interfere with the Commonwealth's ability to continue to obtain information relevant and material to the investigation; and

Because of the non-public nature of the Commonwealth's request, the fact of the on-going investigation, the possibility that the investigation will be harmed if the information is released and the use of the powers of the Grand Jury in this request, the Commonwealth believes that all materials submitted with this motion should be Sealed and Impounded.

Affidavit in Support of Search Warrant

I, Trooper Eric J. Benson #3389, being duly sworn, depose and say:

I am a Massachusetts State Police Trooper and have been so employed since September 22, 2006. I am currently assigned to the Bristol County State Police Detective Unit attached to the Bristol County District Attorney's Office and have been so assigned since November of 2009. My primary responsibilities include the investigation of unattended natural deaths, accidental deaths, suicides, and homicides.

I have personal knowledge of the facts and circumstances related below, as the result of my own investigative efforts and those of other police officers who have reported their findings to me.

I have probable cause to believe that the crime of Murder, a violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 was committed in an unimproved area in the vicinity of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro on or about Monday, June 17, 2013.

I also have probable cause to believe that Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-6-1989) (SS#: [REDACTED]) committed the following crimes on Monday, June 17, 2013: Murder of Odin Lloyd in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 and Possession of Firearm without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(a).

Additionally, I have probable cause to believe that Ernest G. Wallace Jr. (DOB: 01/28/1972) committed the crime of Accessory After the Fact to Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 274, section 4 on Monday, June 17, 2013.

I further have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crimes of Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 and Accessory After the Fact to Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 274, section 4 will be found on and within a gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] [VIN: [REDACTED]]. The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant for the gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] [VIN: [REDACTED]] are as follows:



Initial Response

On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 5:37 p.m., the North Attleboro Police Department responded to a cellular 911 call reporting a dead body in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. The North Attleboro Police Department responded to a secluded area in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro and located a deceased male lying supine on the ground. The initial responding police officers observed several apparent gunshot wounds in the upper torso area of the then unidentified deceased black male. The initial responding officers further observed a small amount of blood in the area of the apparent gunshot wounds. The initial responding officers located five (5) .45 caliber discharged cartridge casings on the ground in the immediate area of the deceased male body. The initial responding officers also located a white towel on the ground in the area where the deceased male was discovered. The initial responding officers did not observe a firearm in the area of the deceased male. The initial responding officers observed a set of automobile tire tracks that appeared to have been recently made in relatively close proximity to the deceased male. The area where the deceased male was found is remotely located and used as a processing area for construction materials such as dirt, gravel, stone, asphalt, and fill. The police did not observe any vehicles at the location where the black male individual was found deceased.

The police conducted a search of the body of the deceased black male during the processing of the crime scene on Monday, June 17, 2013. The police observed that the pants pockets of the deceased male appeared to be undisturbed, leading the police to believe that no post-mortem attempt had been made to remove items from the pants pockets of the victim.

A wallet containing a Massachusetts Drivers License bearing the name Odin L. Lloyd (DOB: 11/14/1985) of 10 Fayston Street, Apt. #2, in Boston was located inside the right rear pants pocket of the deceased black male. The photograph on Odin Lloyd's Massachusetts Driver's License matched the general physical appearance of the deceased male. Two sets of keys for a black 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] were located in the front right pants pocket of the deceased male individual presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. The keychain attached to the two sets of keys for the 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] indicated that the vehicle was owned by Enterprise Rent-A-Car. An HTC 1 cellular telephone was located in the right front sweatshirt pocket of the deceased male presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. An amount of \$64.75 in loose cash was located in the back left pants pocket of Odin Lloyd.

The police contacted Enterprise Rent-A-Car at T.F. Green Airport in Rhode Island and learned that the vehicle described on the keys in the pocket of Odin Lloyd (2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED]) was currently being rented by Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. A check of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles database showed an Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-6-1989) with an address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.



Next of Kin Notification and Preliminary Family Interviews

On the night of Monday, June 17, 2013, police officers traveled to Odin Lloyd's residential address of 10 Fayston Street in Boston in order to attempt to make a death notification to his next of kin. Officers notified Odin Lloyd's next of kin and interviewed some of his friends and family members upon their arrival at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers observed Aaron Hernandez's rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban, the keys to which were found in Odin Lloyd's pocket, backed into the yard behind a chain link fence at 10 Fayston Street in Boston.

Officers interviewed Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou, following the death notification. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she lived with Odin Lloyd at 10 Fayston Street, Apt. #2, in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated that she last saw Odin Lloyd in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston between approximately 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou went on to indicate that she last saw Odin Lloyd when he entered a silver four door car with three other males whose identities she did not know in the area of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that the silver vehicle left the area after Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle. Shaquilla Thibou told investigators that she had never seen this silver car before Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated Odin Lloyd was dating a woman named Shaneah. Shaquilla Thibou explained that Shaneah was the sister of Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend, Shayanna Jenkins. Shaquilla Thibou stated that, other than Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins, she did not know of any other individuals who Odin Lloyd knew in the North Attleboro area. Shaquilla Thibou showed investigators some of the text messages that Odin Lloyd had sent to her after he entered the silver vehicle on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou explained these text messages to investigators and are described below in this affidavit.

Initial contact with Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins

Officers traveled to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro and attempted to make contact with the occupants of the residence on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers were initially unable to make contact with any of the residents of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. While attempting to make contact with the residents, officers observed three (3) large surveillance cameras permanently affixed to the exterior of the residence. Officers also observed that the television and numerous lights were on inside the residence. Despite repeated efforts to summons the occupants, no one came to the door of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Based on the totality of the circumstances that brought the police to the residence and the inability of the police to make contact with the residents, the officers went to the rear of the 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro to determine if there was any forced entry or sign of the occupants. The officers did not observe any signs of forced entry or the residents of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

The officers then proceeded to a neighboring residence and spoke with a neighbor who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots. The individual who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots indicated that he had last seen Aaron

Hernandez, a player for the New England Patriots, at football practice on Thursday, June 13, 2013. The individual who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots did not have any contact information for Aaron Hernandez and was unable to provide any information as to the whereabouts of Aaron Hernandez.

These same officers returned to their vehicle and were parked on the street in front of Aaron Hernandez's residence when they observed Aaron Hernandez exit his residence and walk down the driveway in their direction at approximately 10:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez told the officers that he had seen them parked in front of the house through his video surveillance system. The officers identified themselves and asked Aaron Hernandez questions about the Chevrolet Suburban he had rented. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle for his friend "O." When asked who "O" was, Aaron Hernandez replied "Odin." When asked how he knew Odin, Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend's sister was dating Odin. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle from Enterprise Rent-A-Car on Route 1 in North Attleboro. When asked when he last saw Odin, Aaron Hernandez replied that he last saw Odin "up his way yesterday," indicating that he last saw Odin in Boston on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Although Aaron Hernandez was unable to provide the officers with the location where he last saw Odin, he stated that he (Aaron Hernandez) saved the address in his GPS. Aaron Hernandez then became argumentative with the officers, and asked: "what's with all the questions?" Aaron Hernandez then stated that the police would need to speak with his attorney. Aaron Hernandez entered his residence, locking the door behind him, and retrieved a business card for his attorney. Aaron Hernandez then unlocked the door and handed his attorney's business card to the officers. When the officers told Aaron Hernandez that they were conducting a death investigation, Aaron Hernandez slammed the door and locked it behind him. Aaron Hernandez did not ask the officers whose death was being investigated nor did he display any outward signs of concern. Contact was then made with Aaron Hernandez's attorney.

The officers returned to their vehicle once again. Shortly after the officers returned to their vehicle, Aaron Hernandez exited his residence and stated that he would follow the officers to the police station to speak with the police. Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) would give him a ride to the police station. The officers followed Aaron Hernandez and his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) to the North Attleboro Police Department. Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) drove away after dropping Aaron Hernandez off at the North Attleboro Police Department. Aaron Hernandez entered the police station and was escorted to the Detective Division. Aaron Hernandez awaited the arrival of his attorneys in an interview room within the Detective Division of the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators observed Aaron Hernandez lying on the floor of the interview room while awaiting the arrival of his attorney. Aaron Hernandez was also observed using his cellular telephone while inside the interview room at the North Attleboro Police Department.

Investigators followed Shayanna Jenkins out of the parking lot and stopped Shayanna Jenkins' vehicle a short distance away from the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators then spoke with Shayanna Jenkins (DOB: 05/29/1989). Investigators informed Shayanna Jenkins about the death of Odin Lloyd. Shayanna Jenkins immediately began to cry upon learning that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shayanna Jenkins agreed to speak to the



investigators where her vehicle had been stopped because her child was sleeping in the back seat of the vehicle.

Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and her boyfriend, Aaron Hernandez, live together at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd was in a dating relationship with her sister, Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was not very familiar with Odin Lloyd and claimed not to know Odin Lloyd's family or any of Odin Lloyd's friends. Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd knew each other through Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she last saw Odin Lloyd at approximately 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez were both inside the black Chevrolet Suburban at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd discussed returning the rental vehicle to Enterprise Rent-A-Car.

Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Odin Lloyd smoked marijuana and was also a marijuana dealer. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she would often observe Odin Lloyd on his telephone talking about marijuana sales. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Odin Lloyd's telephone was constantly ringing and that he was frequently talking in "lingo," leading her to believe the conversations were about marijuana sales. Investigators have spoken with more than two dozen individuals who knew Odin Lloyd and have not located any other witness who described Odin Lloyd as a large scale drug dealer.

Shayanna Jenkins provided investigators with the cellular telephone numbers for Aaron Hernandez and her sister, Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number was [REDACTED]. Aaron Hernandez had a cellular telephone in his possession while he was at the North Attleboro Police Department on Monday, June 17, 2013. An investigator called the telephone number [REDACTED] while Aaron Hernandez was at the North Attleboro Police Department on Monday, June 17, 2013. The cellular telephone that Aaron Hernandez had in his possession was observed to ring when the investigator called telephone number [REDACTED] on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez answered his cellular telephone, but the investigator hung up without speaking to Aaron Hernandez.

Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and Aaron Hernandez had recently installed a video surveillance system within their residence. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that this video surveillance system would allow for the viewing of both the front of their residence as well as the street. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that the video surveillance system recorded and played the video on their home entertainment system. Shayanna Jenkins stated that there had been several recent break-in attempts at their residence.

Shayanna Jenkins further stated that both she and Aaron Hernandez were home during the day on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and Aaron Hernandez had gone out to dinner for Father's Day and a babysitter had stayed with their infant child. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that she had gone to bed early but Aaron Hernandez had gone out on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was unsure who Aaron Hernandez had gone out with or what time Aaron Hernandez came home on the night of

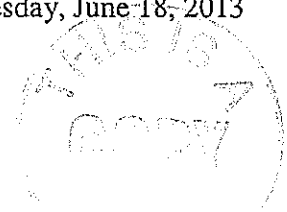
Sunday, June 16, 2013 into Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez called Shayanna Jenkins on her cellular telephone while she was speaking with the police and informed her that his sports agent said that she should not speak with the police and that she should request to speak with her attorney. Shayanna Jenkins then departed from the area of the North Attleboro Police Department.

Aaron Hernandez's attorneys arrived at the North Attleboro Police Department at approximately 12:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 18, 2013. An Assistant District Attorney, a Massachusetts State Police Lieutenant, and a North Attleboro Police Detective Sergeant met with the attorneys in a conference room. Aaron Hernandez signed a consent to search form authorizing the warrantless search of his rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] that was located at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Aaron Hernandez's attorneys agreed that the cellular telephone in the possession of Aaron Hernandez would be maintained without alteration until either Aaron Hernandez consented to provide his cellular telephone to the police or a search warrant was issued for the cellular telephone. Aaron Hernandez left the North Attleboro Police Department in the company of his attorneys on the morning of Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

Cellular Telephone Communication

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone was searched by investigators for information related to the death of Odin Lloyd. Investigators learned that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number appeared as a contact in Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone contacts. The analysis of Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone revealed that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez engaged in extensive text and voice cellular telephone communication on Sunday, June 16, 2013 and Monday, June 17, 2013. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:05 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "I'm coming to grab that tonight u gon b around I need dat and we could step for a little again [sic]." Odin Lloyd did not immediately respond to Aaron Hernandez's text message. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:34 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "Waddup." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:37 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite (meaning alright), where." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:39 p.m., Aaron Hernandez responded: "idk (meaning I don't know) it don't matter but imma hit u when I'm dat way like Las time if my phone dies imma hit u when I charge it which will be in a lil [sic]." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:00 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite idk anything goin on [sic]" Aaron Hernandez's last text message to Odin Lloyd was at 10:13 p.m. on Sunday, June 16, 2013 and read: "I'll figure it out ill hit u on way." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 12:22 a.m., Odin Lloyd sent his last text message to Aaron Hernandez: "We still on." Odin Lloyd's call records show no further cellular telephone communication with Aaron Hernandez.

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone call logs showed that Odin Lloyd received five (5) telephone calls from telephone number [REDACTED] between 1:22 a.m. and 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The last answered incoming telephone call on Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone was from telephone number [REDACTED] at 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators called telephone number [REDACTED] several times on Tuesday, June 18, 2013



in an attempt to contact the last person who spoke to Odin Lloyd by telephone. The telephone associated with telephone number [REDACTED] was not answered on Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, a search warrant was obtained for Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone. On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, investigators conducted a search of Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone and determined that telephone number [REDACTED] was listed in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone contact list. Investigators determined that telephone number [REDACTED] is listed as "Fish 2" in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone. Investigators were able to determine that the contact "Fish 2" in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone is Ernest G. Wallace Jr.

Text messages were located between Aaron Hernandez and two of his (Aaron Hernandez's) associates on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:02 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to telephone number [REDACTED] (Ernest G. Wallace Jr.): "Please make it back cuZ I'm Def trying to step for alittle [sic]" On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:35 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Ernest Wallace: "Get ur as up here [sic]..." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:23 p.m. Aaron Hernandez sent another text message to Ernest Wallace: "Hurry ur ass up nigga [sic]" On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:21 p.m., Aaron Hernandez received a text message from his other male associate who advised: "On r way a...God bless [sic]" Aaron Hernandez then sent a text message to his other male associate: "Bet hurry up tell fish to drive nigga [sic]."

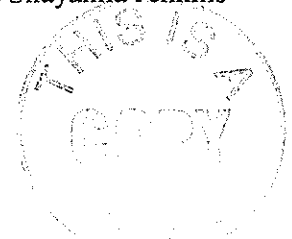
Interviews of Employees from Business in the Vicinity of the Crime Scene

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, and Tuesday, June 25, 2013, investigators interviewed employees from a business that is located within a few hundred yards of the crime scene. These employees described that they were on break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Three employees of this business reported hearing multiple gunshots coming from the area where Odin Lloyd's body was located during their break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Shaneah Jenkins

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 1:05 a.m., the police interviewed Shaneah Jenkins by telephone. Shaneah Jenkins explained that she was Odin Lloyd's girlfriend of over one (1) year. Shaneah Jenkins became very emotional when she was informed that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins claimed that she had not previously known that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins stated that she did not know Odin Lloyd to have any connection to North Attleboro other than her sister, Shayanna Jenkins, and Aaron Hernandez.

Investigators have had further contact with Shaneah Jenkins and learned that Odin Lloyd spent time with Aaron Hernandez on Friday, June 14, 2013 and Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that she was contacted by her sister, Shayanna Jenkins, on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins further indicated that Shayanna Jenkins



explained that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez were together in Boston on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013 into Saturday, June 15, 2013 and that Aaron Hernandez had not returned home. Shaneah Jenkins went on to indicate that Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez was not responding to her attempts to contact him (Aaron Hernandez) on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that she contacted Odin Lloyd on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins further indicated that Odin Lloyd explained that he had gone out with Aaron Hernandez on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013 into Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins went on to indicate that Odin Lloyd stated that he and Aaron Hernandez got drunk and slept outside of the house. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that Aaron Hernandez allowed Odin Lloyd to use his rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban on the morning of Saturday, June 17, 2013.

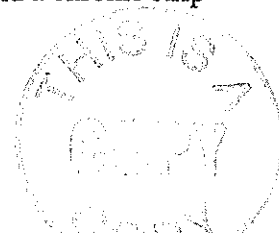
Rumor Nightclub

Investigators have interviewed witnesses working in and around Rumor Nightclub in Boston. Aaron Hernandez is observed entering the nightclub with Odin Lloyd on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013. Additionally, a witness who works in the area of Rumor Nightclub reported to investigators that he observed Aaron Hernandez with what appeared to be a handgun in his waistband on Friday, June 14, 2013.

Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 10:00 a.m., investigators traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car located at 365 East Washington Street in North Attleboro. Investigators spoke with the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who indicated that he was familiar with Aaron Hernandez due to the fact that he (Aaron Hernandez) frequently rented vehicles from Enterprise Rent-A-Car. The manager informed the police that Aaron Hernandez came to Enterprise Rent-A-Car with two unknown male individuals at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager indicated that Aaron Hernandez returned a silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that he had previously rented in his name. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez rented a gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] upon returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that Aaron Hernandez apologized for damage to the driver's side exterior side view mirror and driver's door of the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED]. The manager indicated that although Aaron Hernandez apologized for the damage, he claimed not to know how the damage occurred. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez explained that he just came outside and saw that the vehicle was damaged.

The silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] was viewed by the police at the Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. Investigators observed that there was damage to the front driver's side door. Investigators also observed that the side view mirror on the driver's side was mangled at the connection to the door and the mirror and housing were missing. Investigators further observed damage to the driver's side window and a chrome strip



at the driver's side window. There were also scratches on the driver's side door. Investigators observed soil, similar in color and appearance to that at the location where Odin Lloyd's body was found, on the tires and lower panels of the vehicle behind the tires. Similar soil was also seen within the tire tread(s) and wheel(s) well(s) of the silver Nissan Altima. Investigators also viewed the tire treads and the tire treads appear to be consistent with the tire marks left at the scene where the body of Odin Lloyd was found.

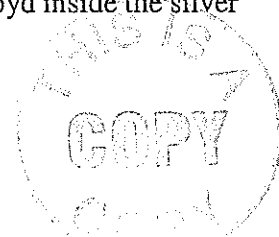
Enterprise Rent-A-Car consented to release the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] to the Massachusetts State Police. Investigators obtained a search warrant for the processing of this vehicle.

Search and Forensic Processing of the Nissan Altima

The 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] was analyzed by the Massachusetts State Police at the State Police Crime Laboratory in Lakeville. The 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] was processed for latent fingerprints by the Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located several fingerprints inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED]. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that were individualized to Odin Lloyd. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that were individualized to an individual with several aliases to Ernest G. Wallace (DOB: 01/28/1972). The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section also located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] that were individualized to another male individual who investigators have determined is associated with Aaron Hernandez.

Shaquilla Thibou

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 4:14 p.m., Shaquilla Thibou was interviewed at the North Attleboro Police Department. Shaquilla Thibou was re-interviewed regarding the information she had concerning the last time she saw her brother alive. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she was speaking with her boyfriend in a car that was parked in the vicinity of her residence located at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that her cellular telephone battery had died at some point while she was seated in the car speaking with her boyfriend. Shaquilla Thibou went on to say that she witnessed a silver four door sedan that she believed to be either a Nissan Altima, a Nissan Maxima, or a Toyota Camry pull up in front of her residence on Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that Odin Lloyd entered the silver vehicle through the rear passenger door and the vehicle drove away from the area of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she believed that there were three other individuals in addition to Odin Lloyd inside the silver vehicle.



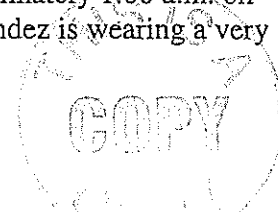
Shaquilla Thibou stated that she entered her apartment and plugged her cellular telephone into a charger on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she received two text messages from Odin Lloyd after she plugged her cellular telephone into the charger. The time stamp on her cellular phone indicated "JUN 17, 2013, 3:07AM" Shaquilla Thibou used this time stamp as a reference to recall the approximate time that she had seen her brother get into the silver four door sedan. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she believed that the time that she last saw Odin Lloyd was approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 rather than the initial timeframe of between 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 that she initially provided to the police.

Video Surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro Showing Activities at the Residence Prior to Leaving to Meet with Odin Lloyd

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, investigators executed a search warrant for 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. As a result of this search, digital video evidence was seized and reviewed by investigators from the home surveillance system. The video surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro has been forensically preserved by the Massachusetts State Police Digital Evidence and Multimedia Section (DEMS) and investigators have had the opportunity to review many of the high definition images captured by the surveillance equipment at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

The surveillance video seized from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez arriving in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez is the operator of a white Audi SUV when he arrives in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video further shows that Aaron Hernandez meets two males in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators have been able to determine through the surveillance images that Ernest Wallace was one of the two males who Aaron Hernandez meets in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video reveals that Aaron Hernandez, Shayanna Jenkins, Ernest Wallace, and a third male individual enter the residence at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Interior surveillance footage shows Aaron Hernandez pass through the living room area of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro while holding an item, identified by investigators as being consistent with a firearm. Aaron Hernandez is observed on the surveillance video moving the item believed to be a firearm between his hands as he passes through the living room.

The surveillance video from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows three male individuals exit the residence in the area of the garage at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The first two male individuals exit the residence together, while the third male individual exits the residence several seconds after the first two. The first male individual depicted on surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 is identified as Aaron Hernandez. Aaron Hernandez is wearing a very



light colored or white hooded sweatshirt, dark colored pants, and light colored footwear. The second male individual depicted on the surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has dark complexion and is wearing a short sleeve light colored shirt, dark colored pants, and dark colored shoes. The third male individual depicted on the surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has the darkest complexion of the three male individuals and is wearing a blue and white long sleeve shirt and dark colored pants. Investigators have identified this male as Ernest Wallace. Ernest Wallace appears to carry a light colored plastic bag in his right hand. All three male individuals walk down the driveway towards the street and exit the view of the surveillance video. A short time later, a silver four door vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima reverses up the driveway and parks near the garage. Aaron Hernandez exits the driver's seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima and approaches the garage. Ernest Wallace exits the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle and walks to the rear of the vehicle while apparently manipulating an object in his hands. Ernest Wallace walks around the vehicle and opens the trunk through the open driver's side door after finding the trunk to be locked. Ernest Wallace then opens the trunk of the silver vehicle and appears to manipulate objects inside the trunk for several seconds. Ernest Wallace appears to hand Aaron Hernandez an item that he retrieved from the trunk of the silver vehicle. Aaron Hernandez enters the silver four door vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima with the item that Ernest Wallace retrieved from the trunk of the vehicle. All three male individuals exited the silver vehicle and entered the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The three male individuals then exit the garage and enter the silver vehicle at approximately 1:12 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Ernest Wallace enters the driver's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Aaron Hernandez enters the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The third male individual wearing a short sleeve light colored shirt, dark colored pants, and dark colored shoes enters the silver vehicle through the rear driver's side door. The silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima then drives down the driveway and disappears from the view of the surveillance system. The surveillance video shows that the side view mirror on the driver's side of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima was still in place when the vehicle exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 1:12 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Surveillance Video from Blue Hill Express Service Station

On the evening of Sunday, June 23, 2013, investigators received information that a vehicle that Aaron Hernandez was driving may have refueled at the Blue Hill Express service station on Route 138 in the vicinity of Route 93 in Canton during the early morning hours of June 17, 2013. Investigators visited the service station and met with the station attendant. This station attendant was also working the overnight shift on June 17, 2013. The attendant informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez visited the station, refueled his vehicle, and purchased some items from the convenience store which is attached to the service station at approximately 2:00 a.m. on June 17, 2013. The attendant informed investigators that the service station had numerous surveillance cameras and that video may be available.



The service station attendant provided investigators with the sales receipt for the fuel and the items that Aaron Hernandez purchased on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators viewed the fuel receipt and observed that 18.39 gallons of fuel was purchased at 2:09 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 using a Visa credit card belonging to Aaron Hernandez. The convenience store receipt revealed that a "BLACK & MILD CIGAR" and "Bubble Yum Cotton" bubble gum were purchased.

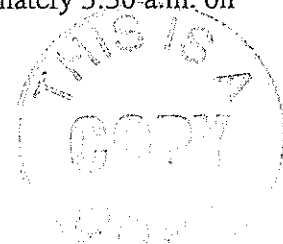
Investigators made arrangements with the owner of the Blue Hill Express service station to obtain surveillance video from the early morning hours of Monday, June 17, 2013. This video was obtained and viewed by investigators. The surveillance video shows a silver sedan entering the service station just after 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The operator of the silver sedan is identified as Aaron Hernandez. Aaron Hernandez refuels his vehicle and then enters the convenience store. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez is wearing a light colored or white hooded sweatshirt, dark pants, and light colored shoes while at the Blue Hills Express service station at approximately 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. On Monday, June 24, 2013, at 1:12 a.m., investigators departed the area of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro driving a 2012 Nissan Altima. Investigators determined that the driving time from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro directly to the Blue Hill Express service station was approximately twenty-five (25 minutes) at that time of the morning. Consequently, the evidence shows that Aaron Hernandez did not drive directly to Blue Hill Express. The evidence also shows that prior to arriving at Blue Hill Express Aaron Hernandez left the front passenger seat and became the operator of the vehicle.

The surveillance video at Blue Hill Express service station shows Aaron Hernandez purchasing a cigar and a package of what appears to be bubble gum. The surveillance video at Blue Hill Express service station then shows Aaron Hernandez entering the driver's seat and the third male individual entering the rear passenger's seat of the silver vehicle. The silver vehicle then exits the Blue Hill Express service station traveling in the direction of Route 93.

The time that the silver sedan departed from the Blue Hill Express service station, and the geographic location of the Blue Hill Express service station coincide with the timeline and route of travel that investigators believe Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace and the third male individual take to arrive at 10 Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. On Monday, June 24, 2013, investigators drove from the Blue Hill Express service station to 10 Fayston Street in Boston via Route 95/128 and Route 93. Investigators determined that the travel time is approximately 19 minutes.

Video Surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro Showing Activities at the Residence after the Murder of Odin Lloyd

The video surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows that the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima returns to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the same third male individual are observed exiting the silver vehicle in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on



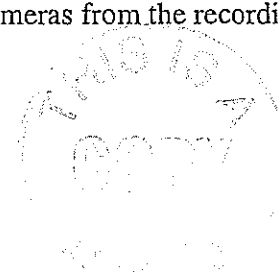
Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez is shown exiting the driver's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Ernest Wallace is shown exiting the front passenger seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The third male individual is shown on surveillance exiting the rear driver's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual entered the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The interior video surveillance at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez enter and exit the basement on several different occasions while also going into other rooms within the residence. Aaron Hernandez is shown on surveillance video to be in and out of the basement on several different occasions while also going to other rooms within the residence. On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 3:33 a.m., Aaron Hernandez is observed to be standing at the entrance to the basement with what appears to be a gun in his hand. Aaron Hernandez is observed to move the gun between his hands. After about six minutes of being in the residence, Aaron Hernandez enters the basement for the final time after being inside his residence for approximately six minutes. There is no activity seen until the recording stops after 3:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The exterior video surveillance at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual exit the garage and approach the rented 2012 Nissan Altima parked in the driveway at approximately 4:52 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video surveillance further shows that Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual enter the 2012 Nissan Altima and drive away from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 4:54 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video surveillance shows that a gray vehicle consistent with a gray Chrysler 300C entered the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:12 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez exited the driver's seat of the gray vehicle that is consistent with a Chrysler 300C upon arriving in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:12 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Ernest Wallace enters the driver's seat of the gray vehicle that is consistent with a Chrysler 300C. The surveillance video further shows that Ernest Wallace and the same third male individual drive away from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Video Surveillance System at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro

On Thursday, June, 20, 2013, investigators spoke with Michael Connors of Home-Tech Custom Design. Michael Connors installed the video surveillance system at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at the direction of Shayanna Jenkins. Among other things, Michael Connors told investigators that the surveillance system records the video of all cameras continuously unless a cable connecting a camera to the system is disconnected. Michael Connors stated that disconnecting a particular camera cable takes that camera off line while the system continues to record footage from the other connected cameras. Michael Connors further stated that he showed Aaron Hernandez how to disconnect specific cameras from the recording



device in May of 2013. Michael Connors went on to say that he clearly labeled the connections so that Aaron Hernandez could more easily disconnect cameras at locations within his home where and when he wanted to avoid surveillance recordings.

The Massachusetts State Police Digital Evidence and Multimedia Section determined that the time displayed on the surveillance video recovered from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro differed from the accurate, world time, by 2 minutes and 46 seconds. Where times are described in this affidavit they have been adjusted to actual time. Investigators have followed the same procedure to determine the variance of all video surveillance times from accurate, world time. All video surveillance times in this affidavit are described in world time.

Video Surveillance from Fayston Street in Boston

Investigators learned from Boston Police Detectives that there was a video surveillance system at a residence on Fayston Street in Boston. This residence is located across the street from Odin Lloyd's and Shaquilla Thibou's apartment at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Boston Police investigators spoke with the homeowner and obtained a copy of the surveillance footage for Monday, June 17, 2013. Massachusetts State Police investigators reviewed the video surveillance footage and observed that a vehicle that is consistent with a silver colored Nissan Altima arrived in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:33 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video shows a male individual, believed to be the victim Odin Lloyd, enter into the rear passenger's side of the vehicle. [This information is consistent with information provided to the police by Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou.] Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the vehicle as it arrived at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the silver vehicle when it arrived at 10 Fayston Street in Boston because the interior light illuminated the interior of the vehicle when the rear passenger's side door was opened. Investigators were also able to determine through the surveillance video that the operator of the apparent silver Nissan Altima was wearing a white or very light colored shirt. Additionally, investigators observed that the exterior side view mirror on the driver's side of the apparent silver Nissan Altima was intact and attached to the vehicle at that time.

Surveillance Video from John L. Dietsch Boulevard and Landry Avenue in North Attleboro

Investigators conducted a canvass in the area of the crime scene located in the vicinity of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. Investigators learned that there were several surveillance cameras facing the area of John Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. Investigators viewed several surveillance cameras and observed the following:

A vehicle entered John L. Dietsch Boulevard at approximately 3:20 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The vehicle traveled northbound on John L. Dietsch Boulevard toward 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard and the location where the body of Odin Lloyd was discovered. The arrival of the vehicle at this time and location is consistent with the time that investigators

arrived on John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro when they drove a 2012 Nissan Altima from 10 Fayston Street in Boston to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro on Tuesday, June 25, 2013.

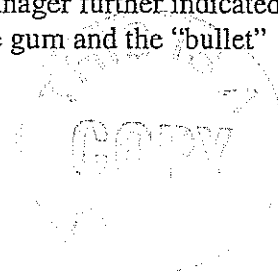
An inspection of the video surveillance from a business near the crime scene shows a vehicle traveling north on John L. Dietsch Boulevard towards the rear of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. This vehicle enters the secluded gravel construction area where the body of Odin Lloyd was discovered. This vehicle entered into the crime scene at approximately 3:23 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 and exits the crime scene at approximately 3:27 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The time of this activity is consistent with the reports of employees at an adjacent business who heard gunshots between 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Surveillance video shows a vehicle leaving the crime scene and turning left out onto John L. Dietsch Boulevard in the direction of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Investigators are aware that the direction of travel is consistent with the vehicle coming from the area of Interstate 95.

Investigators inspected additional surveillance video that showed a vehicle traveling north from the direction of the crime scene toward Landry Avenue in North Attleboro. The vehicle passes this location at approximately 3:28 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Investigators located additional surveillance video showing a vehicle turning left onto Landry Avenue from John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. This vehicle is captured on surveillance video heading west on Landry Avenue in the direction of Westwood Estates and 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. This vehicle is shown at this location less than one minute before the vehicle arrives at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

Search of the Dumpster on the Property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013, the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who had previously been interviewed by police contacted investigators with additional information. The manager indicated that she declined an offer from Aaron Hernandez's of blue bubblegum on the evening of Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager further indicated that she secured the keys to the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] in a safe inside Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013 into Tuesday, June 17, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that she cleaned the silver 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented at approximately 7:45 a.m. on Tuesday, June 17, 2013. The manager indicated that while cleaning the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented, she located four items that she disposed of in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager further indicated that she located a small vitamin water bottle in the front driver's side cup holder of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager went on to indicate that she located what appeared to be a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing in the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager indicated that she found a piece of chewed blue bubble gum and a "bullet" underneath the child's drawing underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager further indicated that she used a piece of paper to pick up the piece of chewed blue bubble gum and the "bullet"



from the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager also recalled that Aaron Hernandez produced Bubblicious Bubble Gum in a blue Bubblicious Bubble Gum wrapper and offered her a piece of gum while he was returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration [REDACTED] to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Officers immediately traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and secured the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers searched the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers located a bottle of Vitamin Water, a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, a piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and a spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers showed the manager photographs of the bottle of Vitamin Water, the piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, the piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and the spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing that were located inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager identified the items in the photographs as being the items that she removed from the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented and threw in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the morning of Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

Second Search of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro

On Saturday, June 22, 2013, the Massachusetts State Police and the North Attleboro Police Department executed a search warrant at the residence of Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11/06/1989) located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive, North Attleboro, MA 02760 in regard to an ongoing criminal investigation.

During the course of the search warrant execution, investigators located a 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle with attached magazine inside a closed black gym bag that was on the back seat of a Toyota sedan that was parked inside the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The rifle was collected as evidence by the State Police Firearms Identification Section.

The rifle was examined by a firearms examiner assigned to the Massachusetts State Police Firearms Identification Section. The State Police firearms examiner determined that the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle was functional and semi-automatic. The State Police firearms examiner test fired the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle and some of the ammunition contained within the magazine that was attached to the rifle when it was located by investigators. The State Police firearms examiner formed the opinion that the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle is a rifle within the meaning of and as defined in Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 140, section 121. The State Police firearms examiner also formed the opinion that the ammunition recovered from within the magazine that was attached to the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle is ammunition within the meaning of and as defined in Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 140, section 121. The State Police firearms examiner also



determined that the magazine that was attached to the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle was a Master Molder magazine with a thirty-three (33) round capacity. The Master Molder magazine contained thirty-three (33) live cartridges of 7.62x39mm caliber ammunition when it was located by investigators.

Investigators also located a box of .22 caliber "Game Loads" ammunition inside a Sentry Safe in the basement of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro during the search warrant execution on Saturday, June 22, 2013.

A query of the Massachusetts Department of Criminal Justice Information Services database revealed that Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11/6/1989) did not have a valid or expired Massachusetts License to Carry Firearms or a Massachusetts Firearms Identification Card on Saturday, June 22, 2013. An additional search of the Massachusetts Department of Criminal Justice Information Services database revealed that 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro is not listed as an address on any Massachusetts License to Carry Firearms or Massachusetts Firearms Identification Cards.

Search of 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. A12, in Franklin

On Wednesday, June 26, 2013, investigators executed several search warrants at an apartment rented by Aaron Hernandez that is located at 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin. Investigators recovered the following items inside 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin: Two boxes of .45 caliber Seminole Arms ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Hornady ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Torbon ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Remington ammunition; One box of .22LR caliber Remington; Four boxes of 7.62 x 39mm Wolf ammunition; One box of 7.62 x 39mm Tulaammo ammunition; and one loose live cartridge of 7.62 x 39mm Wolf ammunition.

Search of 2005 Hummer H2

On Wednesday, June 26, 2013, investigators executed a search warrant on a 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]) that was parked in the parking lot of 599 Old West Central Street in Franklin. The keys to the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]) were located inside 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin. Investigators located a loaded .45 caliber Glock magazine inside the center console of the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]). Investigators also located two receipts and an envelope bearing the name Aaron Hernandez inside the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: [REDACTED]) (Ohio Temporary Registration [REDACTED]).



Search of the Contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker

On Friday, June 28, 2013, a search warrant was executed on a locked container that contained all the items that were removed by Gillette Stadium staff from Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker upon Aaron Hernandez being released from the New England Patriots on Wednesday, June 26, 2013. No firearms, firearms feeding devices, ammunition, or other items of evidentiary value were located within the contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker.

Seizure of the gray Chrysler 300C (Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED])

On the night of Thursday, June 27, 2013, the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] that was rented by Aaron Hernandez on the evening of Monday, June 17, 2013 was located in the parking lot of the Huntington Woods Apartments located at 200 Blakeslee Street in Bristol, Connecticut. This gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 was shown on surveillance video leaving 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video further shows that Ernest Wallace was driving the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] when it exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that a second male, whose identity is known to the police, was a passenger of the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 when it exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

A resident of the Huntington Woods Apartments called the Bristol Police Department on the night of Thursday, June 27, 2013 to report that the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] was parked in the parking lot of the apartment complex. The Bristol Police Department responded to the Huntington Woods Apartments and secured the locked Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED]. The Bristol Police Department seized the locked Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] and towed it to the Bristol Police Department on the night of Thursday, June 27, 2013 into Friday, June 28, 2013. The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] was secured in a locked garage at the Bristol Police Department.

On the morning of Saturday, June 29, 2013, Trooper Jeff Whitehead and Trooper Melvin Rodriguez took custody of the Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] from the Bristol Police Department in Bristol, Connecticut. The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] was towed to the North Attleboro Police Department on a Massachusetts State Police flatbed tow truck. Trooper Jeff Whitehead and Trooper Melvin Rodriguez escorted the Massachusetts State Police tow truck and the Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] to the North Attleboro Police Department. The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] was placed in a secure garage upon its arrival at the North Attleboro Police Department.



The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] has remained locked each time it has been towed.

Arrest of Ernest Wallace

On Friday, June 28, 2013, Ernest Wallace surrendered himself to the Miramar Police Department in Florida on his warrant for Accessory After the Fact to Murder. Ernest Wallace was not in possession of a cellular telephone when he was arrested by the Miramar Police Department in Florida. Ernest Wallace also was not wearing the clothing that he was wearing on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013.

Autopsy

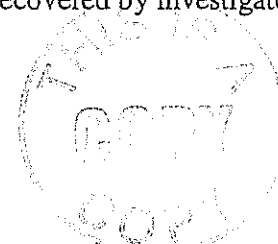
On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, Doctor William Zane of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner conducted the autopsy of Odin Lloyd. Doctor Zane determined that the cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds to the torso area of Odin Lloyd. Doctor William Zane determined that Odin Lloyd was shot in the back and a projectile was recovered in the area of the buttocks. There was a gunshot wound to the right abdomen and a projectile was recovered. There was a gunshot entrance wound to right forearm and there was an exit wound associated with this entrance wound. Two projectiles, consistent with .45 caliber class ammunition were recovered from the body of Odin Lloyd.

Doctor William Zane determined that Odin Lloyd suffered two penetrating wounds which entered Odin Lloyd in the vicinity of each nipple. These wounds completely penetrated the body and no projectiles associated with them were recovered from the body. The paths of both of these wounds were front to back. One projectile penetrated Odin Lloyd's chest, heart lung, liver, and back. The other projectile penetrated Odin Lloyd's chest, lung, ribs and back. Investigators have subsequently been able to recover two projectiles from directly beneath Odin Lloyd's final resting place. This evidence indicates that Odin Lloyd was shot two times in the chest after he was already lying supine on the ground. Doctor William Zane determined that the manner of Odin Lloyd's death was a homicide.

Ballistics

The State Police Firearms Identification Section analyzed the five (5) spent cartridge casings that were recovered from the area near where Odin Lloyd's body was discovered. The State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the five spent cartridge casings were all .45 caliber and were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

The .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro was sent to the State Police Firearms Identification Section for ballistic analysis. The State Police Firearms Identification Section compared the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators



from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro with the five spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body. The State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and the five (5) .45 caliber spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

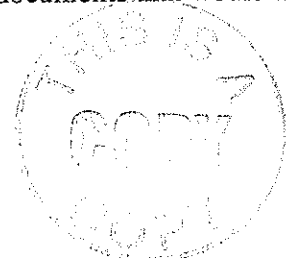
Several searches have been performed in the area between the crime scene and 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro utilizing the State Police SERT Team, the State Police Underwater Recovery Unit, the State Police K-9 section with police K-9's that are trained in the detection of firearms and ammunition, and the State Police Firearms Identification Section with metal detectors, but a .45 caliber firearm has not been recovered during the course of the investigation. Several residences and vehicles have also been searched, some of which are referenced in this affidavit, but as of the application for this search warrant, a .45 caliber firearm has not been recovered during this investigation.

Conclusion

I have personal knowledge, based upon experience and training, that crimes of violence often involve a struggle and the use of weapons or other instrumentalities. I also know that the person or persons participating in the commission of a violent offense are in contact with the physical surroundings and often leave evidence or trace evidence that if collected will help to identify the perpetrators and / or the nature of the crime. I am aware that there is often an attempt to alter, destroy, remove, clean up, or cover up evidence of a crime. I am aware that the perpetrator of a violent crime may remove evidence from the scene and conceal it or destroy it in an attempt to secret it from investigators. I am aware that evidence of a crime may be left in the form of gunshot residue, clothing, physiological fluids, palm prints, fingerprints, shoe prints, fibers, footprints, hair, saliva, semen, blood, firearms, pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns, ammunition, spent cartridge casings, projectiles, cutting instruments, knives, cellular telephones, pieces of identification in print, photograph, or video that may identify any or all of the parties named in the investigation. I am aware that many of these items are minute and / or microscopic, and are often referred to as trace and biological evidence. I am also aware that specialized training and equipment is needed for the collection of such trace and biological evidence.

Based on the aforementioned information provided in this affidavit, I have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crimes of Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 and Accessory After the Fact to Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 274, section 4 will be found on and within a gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED]

I therefore respectfully request that the court issued a search warrant authorizing the search of the gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] VIN: [REDACTED] for trace / biological evidence including blood, serums, and skin; DNA; clothing; shoes; fingerprints; firearms; firearms feeding devices; ammunition; cellular telephones; computers; GPS devices; rental agreement; receipts or documents that would aid in



establishing where the vehicle was between the time that it was rented and the time that it was located by the Bristol Police Department; documents and photographs that would help establish the relationship between Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and Odin Lloyd. I further respectfully request that the court authorize the seizure and further search / forensic processing of any of the above evidence should it be found during the search warrant execution. I also respectfully request permission to video record and photograph the gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] [VIN: [REDACTED]] described in this affidavit.

The gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration [REDACTED] [VIN: [REDACTED]] is registered to Enterprise Rent-A-Car of Rhode Island and is in the custody of the North Attleboro Police Department at the time that this affidavit was written

1. I, Michael B. Bates, being duly sworn, depose and say that I am a Massachusetts State Police Officer, currently assigned to the Bristol County District Attorney's Office as a Narcotics Detective. My responsibilities include narcotics investigations throughout Bristol County.

2. I have been employed as a State Police Officer for the past twenty-one (21) years. I have made numerous narcotic arrests, participated in numerous narcotic investigations and search warrants concerning violations of the Controlled Substance Acts. I have testified in both District and Superior Courts in narcotics related cases. During the course of my duties, I have conducted undercover surveillance and assisted in the execution of numerous search warrants.

3. I have received formalized training for twenty-two (22) weeks by the Massachusetts State Police Academy in New Braintree, MA. including twenty (20) hours of Narcotics identification and investigation. In addition, I have received over eighty (80) hours of formalized training by the Drug Enforcement Administration in Narcotics identification, detection, interdiction, and the prosecution of such related cases. I have also received specialized training and received a certification in the extraction of data from cellular and other electronic devices. I have also provided assistance to the detective unit in investigating numerous major crimes throughout Bristol County, MA.

4. I have attended training and have experience in the recognition, recovery and analysis of information or "data" from electronic devices such as cellular telephones, tablets, and other devices. I have specialized training and experience in the use of recovery and analysis equipment to obtain the data from the aforementioned devices.

5. I have personal knowledge of the facts and circumstances related below, as the result of my own investigative efforts and those of other police officers who have reported their findings to me. Based on all the information gathered, I have probable cause to believe that information related to a Homicide investigation exists on a **Samsung SCH-U365 Cellular "Flip" Telephone with a SKU#:SCHU365HPP and an FCCID#: A3LSCHU365**. The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of the warrant are as follows.

6. This information comes as a result of a lengthy Homicide investigation wherein Odin Lloyd was killed in the early morning hours of Monday – June 17, 2013 in the city of North Attleboro, MA. This investigation is being conducted by the State Police Detectives assigned to the Bristol County District Attorney's Office in conjunction with the North Attleboro Police Department.

7. During the course of the investigation, subject Carlos ORTIZ [01/15/1986] was interviewed on Tuesday – June 25, 2013 in Bristol, CT. While speaking with investigators, ORTIZ did confirm that he was with the suspect of our investigation (Aaron HERNANDEZ) on the night in question. ORTIZ then went on to explain that HERNANDEZ has another address that not many people know about. ORTIZ referred to this location as an apartment style location, commonly referred to as a "flop house". ORTIZ stated that one night after the incident, HERNANDEZ and ORTIZ stopped by this apartment location. ORTIZ stated that he had inadvertently left his cellular telephone inside by mistake.

8. I then applied for and received a search warrant from the Wrentham District Court on Wednesday – June 26, 2013. This search warrant was numbered #1357SW50 and authorized the search for #599 Old West Street – Apt #12A in Franklin, MA for a Samsung cellular telephone matching the description listed above.

9. The search warrant was executed on Wednesday – June 26, 2013. As a result of search, this cellular telephone was located wedged between the cushions and backing of a couch in the living room of the apartment. This cellular telephone was secured at the scene and transported to the North Attleboro Police Department where it was secured in their evidence locker.

10. Investigators are aware that cellular devices are frequently used by victims, witnesses, and suspects. They are used before, during, and after crimes have been committed. 7. On Wednesday – June 26, 2013 at approximately 1330 hours the search warrant was executed at #599 Old West Street – Apt #12A in Franklin. As a result of the search for the Samsung cellular telephone, several different types of ammunition were located. There was at least one (1) round of 7x62x39 caliber ammunition located lying on the top of an end table in the living room. The search also resulted in three different calibers of ammunition located in a dresser drawer next to the night stand in the bedroom. These rounds of ammunition included 7x6x39 caliber, .45 caliber, and .22 caliber.

8. Also located were keys that belonged to a black colored Hummer motor vehicle that was parked outside building A of #599 Old West Street in Franklin, MA. These keys had a very distinctive Hummer logo attached to them, and a remote alarm that linked to that specific vehicle when tested. This motor vehicle only displayed a temporary registration in the window. This temporary registration number was X [redacted] and listed an expiration date of 05/25/2013. This temporary registration also lists the last six (6) digits of the Vehicle Identification Number it belongs to as 123355. Visual check confirms that these digits in fact match the actual Vehicle Identification Number Plate attached to the Hummer. The Association / Management of the apartment complex explained that the Hummer had been parked in that very same spot for at least three (3) days. They also explained that the location it was parked in was not even an actual parking spot and that it was causing issues with other residents. The management was contemplating having the vehicle removed/towed on this date.

9. The original Samsung cellular telephone was still not located, but investigators did freeze the search / apartment at this time. I am now respectfully requesting that an additional search warrant be issued for the same address [#599 Old West Street – Apt #12 in Franklin, MA] allowing investigators to search for any and all ammunition and/or weapons that that might be associated with the ammunition that has been located within the apartment.

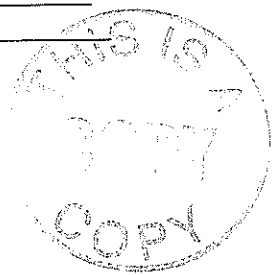
